

Brings Mandamus Against Officers

SALEM, Ore., Jan. 14. (AP)—An original proceeding in mandamus was filed in the supreme court yesterday by E. L. Thompson, manager of the Willamette Valley Irrigated Land Company of Staston, demanding that the Marion county court issue the company a receipt for taxes covering the year 1921.

The amount is \$1674.20. The company contends that no part of its holdings lie within an irrigation district and that no certificate of delinquency has ever been filed against it. The county is attempting to collect interest, penalty and costs, claiming the taxes for that year were not paid. Thompson avers that he has attempted to pay the tax originally

levied against the property but that the county court refuses to accept payment.

The alternative writ is made returnable January 25.

BANDITS START NEW REVOLUTION

EL PASO, Tex., Jan. 14. (AP)—Bandits who butchered the soldier and crew of a passenger train between Guadalupe and Mexico City last Saturday, told George Zapp, an American passenger, that a new revolution in Mexico "has just started."

Zapp, who lives at Globe, Ariz., made this statement upon his arrival today.

"The chief of the bandit gang said to me, 'The revolution down here has just started,' Zapp related.

He asserted all foreigners on the ill fated train were "treated fine." The bandits got quite a little stake out of the robbery for the express car carried a large amount in bullion and cash. Zapp added, "There were eight of us Americans on the train, five men and three women. We were ordered off the Pullman and took refuge in an abandoned hotel building in Yucucaro, where the train had been fired.

"The bandits had stationed men in the town before we arrived and a number were passengers. The chief sat in the back part of the first car and as we neared the town, he arose, walking to the front end, whirled and the soldiers were surrounded and overpowered before they had a chance to shoot.

"Nobody will ever know how many were killed because the train and bodies were burned, but I saw the head and of a car piled with the bodies of soldiers. Two women were shot, but accidentally, I think.

"I have been working on a railway construction gang about 100 miles from Guadalupe. Men come to work with a gun and two rounds of cartridges in their belts."

SWIMMING TEAM IS PRACTICING

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Eugene, Jan. 14. (AP)—The University of Oregon varsity and freshmen swimming teams will start practice in earnest this week, under their new instructor, Ed Abercrombie, who has been chosen to succeed Rudolph Fahl, resigned. To conform with the events as held in intercollegiate meets in the east, the plunge for distance has been dropped from competition.

Two changes have been made, one in starting and the other in the way of scoring in the diving events. In starting only two signals will be given in the future instead of three. In the diving the points scored by the performers will be announced at the conclusion of his attempts.

The list of events for competition will be as follows: 50-yard free style; 150-yard back-stroke; 220-yard free style; fancy diving; 100-yard medley; and 200-yard relay.

Nominal market prevail and produce men say definite prices will not be established until the buyers are again in the market. Country dressed

pork is not influenced by the nominal tone in veal. Choice light hogs are still selling steady at 17 cents.

EXPORT BOUNTY IS HELD NEEDED

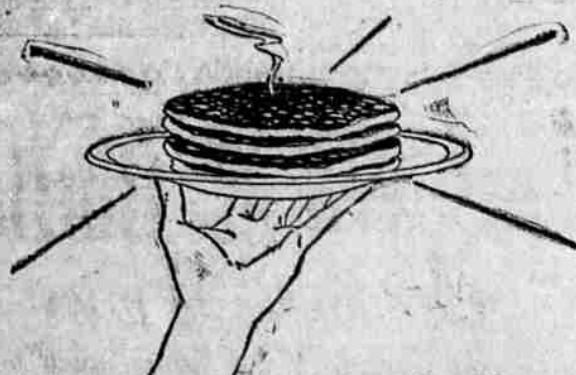
PHOENIX, Ariz., Jan. 14. (AP)—An export bounty was declared to be the most feasible plan for placing the livestock and agricultural industries on a plan of prosperity compared to that of other lines of inquiry by Robert D. Carey, former governor of Wyoming and chairman of President Coolidge's agricultural conference before the annual con-

vention of the American Livestock Association this morning.

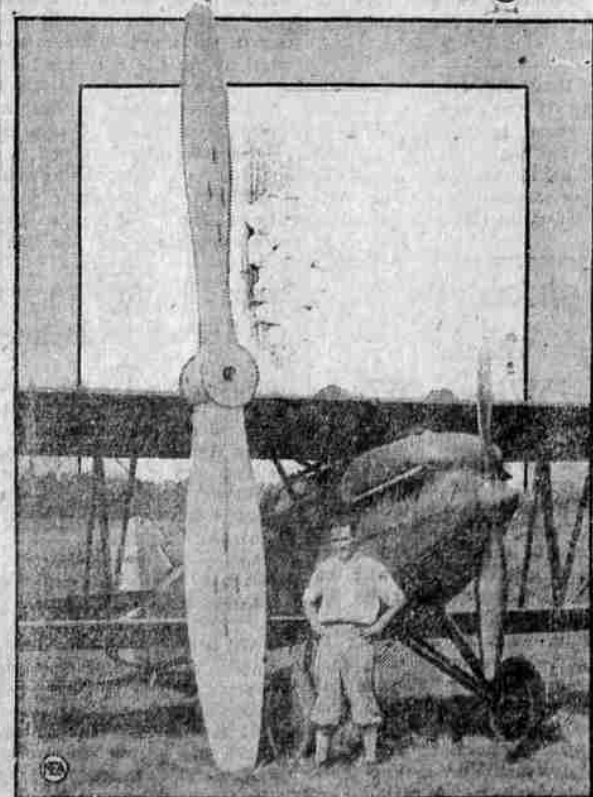

This propeller is 17 1/2 feet long and weighs only 140 pounds. It was made by the U. S. air service at McCook Field, Dayton, O., for the new army dirigible RS-1, under construction at Scott Field, Ill., and weighs less than half as much as it would weigh if made of the wood usually used. It is of balsa wood, the lightest and strongest wood known.

SEVERE WEATHER FOLLOWS FLOODS

PARIS, Jan. 14. (AP)—Both France and Italy are suffering from severe cold waves, central and northern Italy and southward as far as Naples are blanketed with snow. In France the mercury dropped abruptly from sixty degrees Fahrenheit to zero and below at some points. Snow is also falling at various places.

Where last week floods were raging, the water has been converted into frozen swamps over which is howling a bitter easterly gale. The lowest temperature recorded is at Briancon, where five degrees below zero was registered. The thermometer this morning stood only just above zero in Tournai and Burgundy. Central France, and even the sunny south, are affected from Perpignan to Mentone. A heavy fall of snow is ravaging the flower raising country around Nice and Cannes, doing damage estimated at millions of francs. At Toulouse the snow is a foot deep. There are also white mantles at Bordeaux, Montpellier, Avignon and

other cities where snow has not been seen once in ten years.

Violent storms are raging in the Mediterranean which are playing havoc with shipping. Much damage is also being done by the gales to shipping and ports on the west coasts.

Several inches of snow fell in Milan, Turin and Trieste, Italy, while there was considerable precipitation at Florence and other Tuscan cities.

Naples, the warm southern tourist center, also was visited.
