NEW YORK, Jan. 18. —(AP)—Mary Lasker, daughter of Albert Lasker, former chairman of the U. S. shipping board, has been offered the role of the Madonna in "The Miracle," now playing in Chicago. This is the part that has been played by Lady Diana Manners, Rosamund Pinche, niece of Governor Pinchet of Pennsylvania, and Eleanor Patterson, daughter of Joseph Medill Patterson, the Chicago publisher.

The offer of the part was made by Morris Gest, producer of "The Miracle." Miss Lasker and her mother are on their way to this city to consult with Mr. Lasker.

RUBBER PROBLEM WILL BE SOLVED

WASHINGTON, Jan. 18. —(AP)—The American people responding to a national necessity, "are well on the way toward solving the rubber problem, without government aid," Secretary Hoover told the house commerce committee today.

The committee is investigating the effect of the British rubber monopoly and Mr. Hoover declared action such as that taken by the newly formed American Motor Rubber company, which contemplates definite projects in Ceylon, Dutch East Indies and the Philippines would bring the necessary relief.

Coolidge Planning Several Speeches

WASHINGTON, Jan. 18. —(AP)—President Coolidge apparently intends to confine his speech making to Washington for the next few months.

He will address the semi-annual budget meeting here January 30, but has declined a score of out of town invitations, including one to speak Friday before republican editors of Indiana in Indianapolis, and several asking him to visit various cities in the south during the winter.

Farmer Still Rules Favorite For His Fight Tomorrow Night With Big Kellogg Heavyweight

Big Crowd Watches Final Public Workout And Favors Tacoma Veteran—Real Two-Fisted Battle Promised Klamath Boxing Fans

With the big crowd which watched the final public workouts at Scandia hall yesterday, Frank Farmer, Tacoma veteran, still ruled a big favorite over Willie Keeler of Kellogg, Idaho, for their 10-round bout tomorrow night.

Keeler's promise that he is going to start a two-fisted fighting attack and keep it up apparently has not registered strong with the boys who have been watching the daily workouts, and there's going to be an abundance of Farmer money in evidence when the two big heavyweights start crashing gloves in each other's direction.

Keeler wants to win by a knockout, but Farmer is a wily old veteran who has stood on his feet against some of the best fighters in the country and he hasn't got any idea that he will be knocked kicking down here in Klamath Falls.

He's wrecked more championship hopes than any heavyweight in the west and he hasn't done it by being knocked out.

But even with all of Farmer's assurance that he will repeat his victory over Keeler, the Idaho fighter still has a lot of backers who figure he will beat the Puget Sound logger, and it is this difference of opinion which makes prizefights as well as horse races and newspapers.

Jack Crim and Wilbur Harrington are going to furnish the ringworms with their full quota of excitement when these two clever Indian lads meet in the six round semi-windup. Both boys are fighting for real recognition and have been promised bigger and better fights on the next card depending on what they do tomorrow night.

If Crim wins he will get a chance at Kid Starkey, one of the most popular boys who ever fought here, while Harrington, if he beats Crim, will have a chance to battle Joe Gorman or some other good boy.

Crim is more confident right now than he ever was before and confidently expects to knock Harrington out. Harrington's backers think he is too fast to let the Modoc Indian slip over the fatal punch.

Jim O'Dowd and Joe Walters will battle it out for four rounds while Kid Huff and Al York are scheduled to open with four rounds of fast milling.

POLAR TRIP TO START SHORTLY

DETROIT, Mich., Jan. 18. —(AP)—The expedition to be led into the polar regions by Captain George H. Wilkins is not dependent upon snow motors for its success, officials of the expedition here said today in discussing the pessimistic prediction of Captain E. T. McIntyre, veteran Alaska trader, musher and adventurer.

"If the snow motors fail to make the long haul from Fairbanks to Point Barrow, then the original plans will be carried out and two Fokkers will fly the distance," E. S. Evans, manager of the expedition, said.

The veteran musher had predicted the failure of the expedition due to the inability of the snow motors to make the haul through the ice-locked trails of the north with supplies.

"Furthermore," Mr. Evans said, "we rely on the opinion of 'Sandy' Smith, who is in charge of the snow motors and who believes he can break a trail with them."

"Sandy" has been on the ground since 1898, he knows every dog trail in Alaska. In fact, two rivers are named after him. We believe he is a better judge of conditions than McIntyre."
