

# TARIFF ATTACK STARTED TODAY

WASHINGTON, Jan. 18. —(AP)—The democratic assault on the tariff, begun by members of the house, went forward today at the other end of the capitol. Senator Harrison, democrat, of Mississippi, declared in a senate speech that high tariff rates place a heavy burden on the farmer. Whenever he buys farm implements, paint for a shed, a sealing machine, a pill, a thimble or a safety pin, as well as hundreds of other necessities of life, the senator said, the farmer pays a tariff levy. Senator Smoot, republican, Utah, replied that at the request of the farm bloc, duties were included in the last tariff act on virtually all farm products, but Senator Harrison

insisted the benefit was negligible since little farm produce is imported. Senator Borah, republican, Idaho, inquired "whether the farmers' tariff worries will be ameliorated by reductions in the surtaxes and repeal of the inheritance tax."

## Court Will Review Shipbuilding Case

WASHINGTON, Jan. 18. —(AP)—The supreme court today agreed to review the Skinner and Eddy Shipbuilding case growing out of conclusion of war time shipbuilding contracts on the Pacific coast.

The case involves the right of Skinner and Eddy, contractors, to compel Comptroller General McCarr to pass upon their claims against the emergency fleet corporation, which grew out of the cancellations. The comptroller general has insisted the shipbuilding board should adjust the dispute.
