State Game Warden Backing Down on Recent Closing Regulations

ORDER NOT IN EFFECT

Charges Will Not be Made if Anglers Think They Are Unjust, He Says

PORTLAND, Ore., Jan. 21.—(AP)—State Game Warden Ed F. Averill today asked sportsmen of the state to forward to him any objections which they may have to orders recently issued by the game commission closing certain streams for conservation purposes.

Petitions Asked—The commission desires to hear from each sportsman having any objections to offer. It is important that those making objections should state the names of the streams affected by the closing orders which they think should be left open.

Purpose of Closing—The purpose of the closing orders is to establish feeders for the main fishing streams. The commission is now planting only four to six inch trout.
