Joe Gorman Arrives Today For His Bout With Benny Dotson At Scandia Hall Early Next Week

Two Fast and Clever Featherweights Will Top Fistic bill—Bobby Ross Will Battle Frankie Doyle, Oakland, Calif., Welterweight

Joe Gorman, Grants Pass apple grower and Pacific coast glove thrower, checked in this afternoon with his gym shoes and arnica, all ready to start his daily dozen in preparation for his bout at Scandia hall a week from tonight with Benny Dotson, Portland battler.

Although still young in years, Joe is a veteran of the roped arena, and is taking good care of himself in order to keep in the going yet for several years. The little Spaniard nowadays takes on about four or five fights a year. He will go 10 rounds and then go back to the Rogue River apple trees and rest up for two or three months before donning the battling spangles again. In this way, he is always in good condition to put up one of his old-time scraps any time he decides he's ready to go.

Dotson, a confident fast-moving kid, has mapped out plenty of trouble for himself in taking on the wily Gorman, but the little orchestra leader is confident he can take the measure of Gorman, and is showing the ringworms a lot of real stuff in his daily workouts. When Frank Farmer was here a few weeks ago he predicted a great future for Dotson, and Benny figures a win over the widely heralded Gorman will set him right for a tumble from Portland and Seattle promoters at the head of the bill.

Frankie Doyle, 138-pounder from Oakland, will meet Bobby Ross in the semi-windup. Many of the fans want to see Bobby in action again, and Ross is just as anxious to take on Doyle as though he were an ambitious kid just starting the game. Ross isn't through yet by any means. Those who saw him train with Frank Farmer remembered how he stood up against the Tacoma heavyweight and swap blow for blow. If Doyle is as good as his press clippings indicate, it ought to be a great battle, with Ross a slight favorite because he is so well known and so well liked by the older boxing fans of this section.

The remainder of the card is being signed up and will be announced probably tomorrow. Jim Fleming wants to show his stuff and Meehan is trying to find a suitable opponent for him in a four-rounder, while it is possible that Buddy Crim, younger brother of Jack, may go in with a good boy in the first preliminary. Young Crim fought up at Chillicothe last summer and put his man away in less than two rounds. He is one of the hardest hitting youngsters in this section.

Make Extended Trip In Their Chevrolet

Klamath Town Team To Play Hard Schedule

It was announced this morning by Manager Walsh.

Former games were played on the Altamont pavilion floor, but as this space is now utilized by the Universal Picture company, the town team is seeking another floor. The only available floor is in the Legion hall.

A game is scheduled with Merrill for Wednesday, January 27, and another with Malin, January 30.

Manager Walsh was in Ashland and Medford Friday and scheduled games with the fast national guard, battery B quintet, at Klamath Falls on February 9; and with the Medford national guards, company A, February 11. Both these teams are reputed to be as fast as any in Oregon, three of the Medford players having represented Oregon in the Oregon state championship held at Chicago last year. Klamath Cardinals, play at Medford February 18 and Ashland February 23.

Finals for the championship of Klamath county are to be played on February 20 and 27.

WILLING TO WED TO ASSIST GIRL

NEW YORK, Jan. 24. (AP)—Stanley Yale Beach, descendant of William the Conqueror, and Elihu Yale, is determined to give a 17-year-old illegitimate daughter as many advantages as his three legitimate children.

The story of a 20-year liaison with another woman, whom he wishes to marry, has been revealed in Mr. Beach's announced determination to fight efforts of his wife and family to prevent him from providing for Mrs. Caroline Watson and their child.

Suit has been started by Beach to compel the direct payment to him of the income from a trust fund established by his grandfather, Alfred S. Beach, founder of the Scientific American.

The suit is to offset an action taken by Mrs. Beach and other members of his family in a Connecticut contest which resulted in the appointment of a conservator for him on account of "mental derangement and physical infirmity."

Mr. Beach said yesterday that he had long ago sought a divorce from his wife but she had objected. He stated he would again attempt to divorce her in order to marry Mrs. Watson and legitimize Marguerite. At one time, he said, he was on the point of legally adopting the child, when his wife, although at first agreeing, objected.

Ford Motor Company Output Still Grows

The Ford Motor Company, in all its divisions, produced a total of 2,103,588 cars, trucks, tractors and airplanes during 1925, according to figures just given out at the general offices of the Ford Motor company. Exclusive of airplanes, which is a new industry with the company, this is an increase of 20,933 automotive units over 1924.

In the production of Ford cars and trucks during the year, domestic plants in the United States assembled 1,775,425. Foreign plants of the company produced 136,461 cars and trucks and the output of the Ford Motor Company of Canada, Ltd., totaled 78,239. Fordson tractor production was 104,168 and the Lincoln division of the company produced during the year a total of 8,415 Lincoln cars. In the newest division of the company, the airplane factory, the output was ten all-metal planes since the factory was acquired by the company on August 1, 1925.

Overland Announces New Price Schedule

Announcement was made by Willys-Overland, Inc., at the New York Automobile Show, of the prices on the new "70" Willys-Knight Six, that of the five-passenger sedan being set at \$1495 while the touring will sell for \$1295, f. o. b. Toledo.

This price has been eagerly awaited since the Seventy was presented at the automobile show and it was known that Willys-Overland would step into the great middle size car field with a six-cylinder Knight type motor.

It was generally anticipated that the price would be much higher than the figures which were announced yesterday in view of the lavish equipment and the general refinement throughout this car.

RESUME FLIGHT

LAS PALMAS, Canary Islands, Jan. 26. (AP)—Commander Franco and two other Spanish aviators today resumed their flight from Spain to Argentina. They hopped off for the Cape Verde islands at 8:24 a. m., in their plane, No. Plus Ultra.

PARKER RETURNS SOUTH

S. K. Parker, an official of the Ritchfield Oil company at Chico, after spending several days in the city on business, has returned south. Mr. Parker was accompanied by S. Sharkey, also identified with the oil industry.

FOR KLAMATH INDIANS

WASHINGTON, Jan. 26. (AP)—A bill to reserve for members of the Klamath Indian tribe all merchantable timber on tribal lands on their reservation in Oregon, was introduced today by Representative Leavitt, Montana, chairman of the Indian affairs committee.

MANY INDICTED IN BOOZE CASE

NEW YORK, Jan. 26. (AP)—Thirteen members of the coast guard and 48 other individuals were indicted today by a federal grand jury investigating the alleged bootleg syndicate headed by "Bill" Dwyer, former race track owner.

Nine of the coast guardsmen named in the indictment are still in the active service. Three separate indictments were returned, charging the 61 defendants with violation of

the federal prohibition law and conspiracy to violate the law.

The grand jury has spent six weeks in investigating the alleged rum ring, which is represented by the federal authorities as having controlled 18 ocean steamers in the rum running business. Dwyer and more than a score of his confederates were arrested in December and since then four boats supposed to have been in the trade have been seized.

APPROPRIATION WITHHELD

WASHINGTON, Jan. 26. (AP)—The house today amended the naval appropriation bill to withhold for six months a fund of \$300,000 for contracting for an all-metal aircraft.
