WOMAN ATHLETIC STAR ENDANGERS AMATEUR STATUS

Oppose Practice of Helen Wills in Writing News- paper Articles

NEW YORK, Jan. 29. — (AP) —
Miss Helen Wills is jeopardizing her
amateur eligibility if, as reported,
she has been writing current news-
paper articles on her tournament
playing in France. Jones W. Merse-
reau, president of the United States
Lawn association, declared today.

Taking cognizance of cable re-
ports of the American woman cham-
pion's literary activities, Mr. Merse-
reau made clear the position of the
U. S. Lawn Tennis association on the
player-writer rule, pointing out
that Miss Wills, although competing
abroad, is just as much subject to
jurisdiction as though she were at
home.

"I am quite sure that Miss Wills
has not knowingly broken any rules,"
said Mr. Mersereau's statement. "And
if she had had any misunderstanding
will immediately put herself right."
