

To Investigate Hay Production On Klamath Land

Word has just been received that H. M. Selby and A. S. Burrier of the U. S. Department of Agriculture and the Oregon Agriculture College will be in Klamath County, starting Wednesday, February 17th, to spend several days in accumulating data on the cost of producing hay and the efficiency of haymaking methods in Klamath county.

This work is also being conducted in several counties in Oregon in order to arrive at costs and ascertain the cheapest and best methods of putting up hay. The Department of animal husbandry, farm

crop, dairying and farm management, in the experiment station, are cooperating in this statewide economic study of forage crops, under the recently enacted Purcell bill.

During their stay here Mr. Selby and Mr. Burrier will visit about 40 representative farms scattered throughout the county, in order to get the most accurate data possible. They have just completed work in Jackson and Josephine counties at this time.

sions was a special order of business for today. Involved in the controversy is the whole question of the extent in which senate inquiries are to be ordered in the future.

Republicans in a party conference yesterday decided that the breaks should be applied on investigations and the aluminum case will furnish the first testimony of strength of those who hold the senate, particularly during the last two years, has far exceeded its rightful functions in the matters of inquiries.

The original inquiry into the aluminum company was ordered by the senate in 1922. Two years later, in the midst of the last presidential campaign, the trade commission held that provisions of the consent decree entered into between the government and the company had been violated. This report was transmitted to the justice department, which nearly a year ago started the investigation now concluded.

Frank Z. Howard is severely ill at the family home suffering with an attack of influenza.

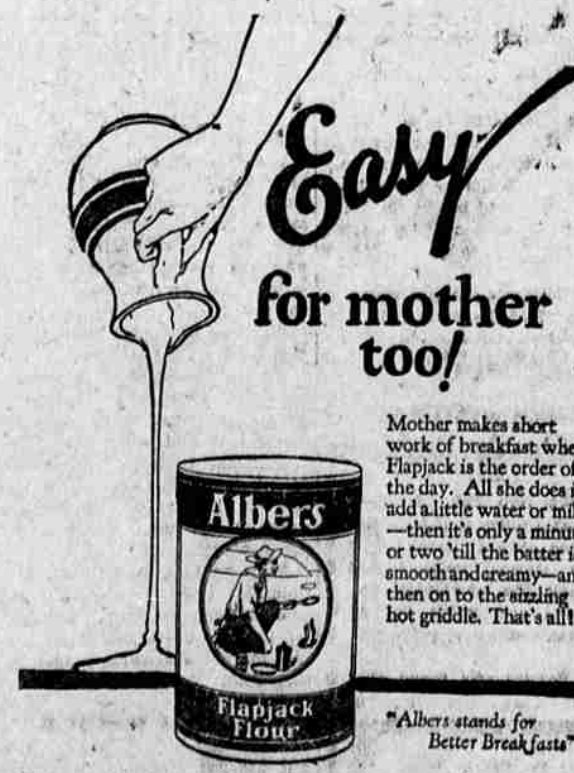
MRS. HILLUS BACK
