

Masked Foray Ends In Death

Slaughter Comes When Intended Victim Fires

ROYSTON, Ga., March 11. (AP)—One man is dead and two were seriously injured, one perhaps fatally as a result of a shooting affray here last night which was precipitated by the visit of a band of fifty or more white-robed men to the home of H. L. Bigby, lumberman.

Sheriff T. H. Moss today expressed the opinion that the members of the band, who had surrounded Bigby's house, became confused when he opened the door and began firing and shot each other, and Bigby.

Walton Adams, well known farmer, who was killed, and Ben Harrison, who was seriously wounded are

believed by the sheriff to have been members of the band.

Bigby is in an Anderson, N. C. hospital, shot through the head, and little hope is held for his recovery.

The sheriff said the band had visited Bigby because of alleged attentions he paid to a married woman here. He also added a secret organization had recently sent Bigby warning him to cease his attentions to the woman.

Oregon Fire Loss Near Half Million

SALEM, Ore., March 11. (AP)—Fire losses in Oregon, exclusive of Portland, for the month of February totaled \$435,965.65, according to Will Moore, state fire marshal. Losses of \$10,000 or more were: Eugene, mercantile building and contents, \$25,000; Ferndale, school and contents, \$20,000; North Bend, lumber mill \$300,000; Umatilla county school and contents \$14,769.

HOOP TOURNEY GAMES LINED UP

SALEM, Ore., March 11. (AP)—Baker and Astoria high schools meet in the opening game of the state basketball tournament at 3 o'clock this afternoon, with the McLoughlin (Milton-Freewater) and Marshfield clash following at 4 o'clock. Grant high, of Portland, a last minute entrant which called for new drawings, meets Medford at 7:30 o'clock tonight, followed by the Eugene-The Dalles encounter.

At 7:30 winners of Medford-Grant vs. winner of Eugene-The Dalles.

Finals are to be played Saturday night at 8:30 o'clock when the winners of the Medford-Grant-The Dalles-Eugene games meet the winners of the Astoria-Baker-Marshfield-Salem and Hillsboro games. Winners of the second flight meet at 7:30 o'clock to decide third place in the tournament.

Machine Skids in Making Sudden Stop

ROSEBURG, Ore., March 11. (AP)—Albert D. Jones, a machinery salesman of Portland, was instantly killed yesterday afternoon about 4 o'clock when his roadster went over a steep grade on the Coos Bay highway, about seven miles west of Camas Valley. A large state highway crew was engaged in widening the road at that point, and a truck was turned across the road dumping rock. Mr. Jones came around a turn directly upon the truck and in trying to stop skidded his car over the grade.

The machine rolled down about 100 feet.

Coroner Ritter is endeavoring to locate relatives and has obtained the address of a sister, Gertrude M. Jones, at Allston, Mass., and has wired her regarding the accident.
