NEW GOLD STRIKE THRILLS ALASKA

Nome Citizens Join Stampede to Beach Diggings, Record Pans Reported

NOME, Alaska, March 12.—(P)—Reports of a gold strike near Bluff, about sixty miles east of here, caused many persons to stampede from here yesterday. Dog teams were in great demand. Old prospectors believe that the strike is the same kind of beach digging as found in the vicinity of Nome and that it continues up and down the Bering sea coast for many miles.

An 18 inch pay streak averaging \$3 a pan was said to have been found. Merritt and Childie, owners of placer property in the district, discovered a 150 foot tunnel in from the sea beach. They first obtained dirt paying 15c a pan, finally ranging to \$3.

CALL OFF JAUNT TO TACNA-ARICA

Believed Possible Peru may Withdraw from Further Negotiations in Matter

WASHINGTON, March 12.—(P)—Travel reservations for Assistant Solicitor Vallance of the state department and other members of the American group selected to assist Major General Lassiter in the conduct of the Tacna-Arica plebiscite, were suddenly cancelled today.

No explanation for the cancellation was forthcoming.

Vallance with legal counsel, three finger print experts and fifteen clerks and stenographers, had booked passage on a Chilean line ship departing from New York tomorrow.

The incident is regarded as possibly significant in view of Peru's effort to have the registration for the plebiscite, scheduled to begin Monday, postponed. It was also thought it might bear possible relationship to suggestions which are believed to have been made by Peru that unless the registration is postponed and Chilean guarantees enforced, Peru would withdraw from the plebiscite.

RUBBER PROBE NOW PROJECTED

Profits of Rubber companies too Much, Belief of New York Solon

WASHINGTON, March 12.—(P)—Action on a resolution to investigate the profits of American rubber manufacturers was demanded today by Representative Black, democrat, New York, in a letter to Chairman Snell of the house rules committee, which has jurisdiction over the proposal. Shortly after his resolution was adopted, he said, American tire companies announced a ten per cent reduction in prices.

Mrs. Mamie Howard left this morning for Lakeview where she plans to visit friends and relatives for a short time before leaving for Eugene where she plans to make her future home.

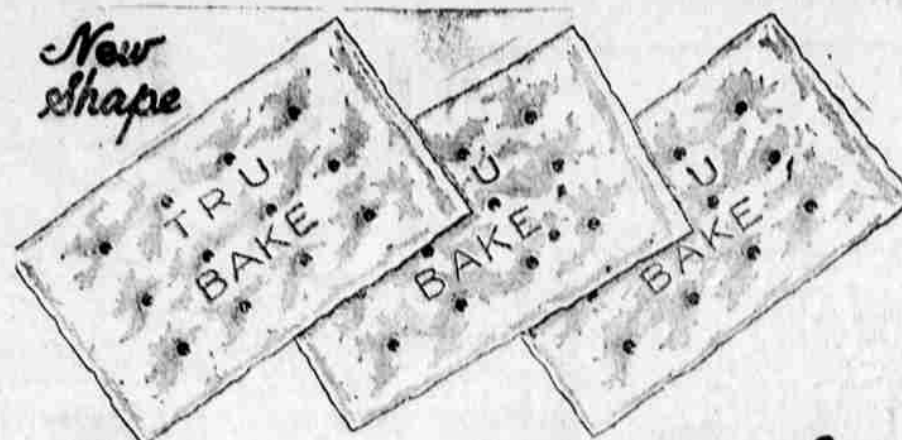

MARKET BRIEFS

PORTLAND, Ore., March 12.—(P)—Slightly higher prices at Pacific Northwest shipping points is causing some interest in the local potato trade. Considerable eastern demand received at Yakima has already brought top grades up to \$57 a ton. The ruling price hovers around \$53 to \$56 a ton for United States number 1 Gems.

Indications are that certified seed potatoes and going to be scarce and high priced this spring. Sales already made have been at high levels and a shortage of certified stock will probably force the market higher as the demand gets into full swing.

County agents in many of the Portland growing districts state that their seed stock has already been sold out.

Local dairy markets generally steady and unchanged. A half cent decline in current receipt eggs to 22½c is the only change on the dairy board. Prices are well maintained in country dressed meats and poultry today with offerings moderate. Heavy hens up to 26 and 27c with light hens at 21 to 22c. Top hogs 18 to 18½c; top calves 17 cents.

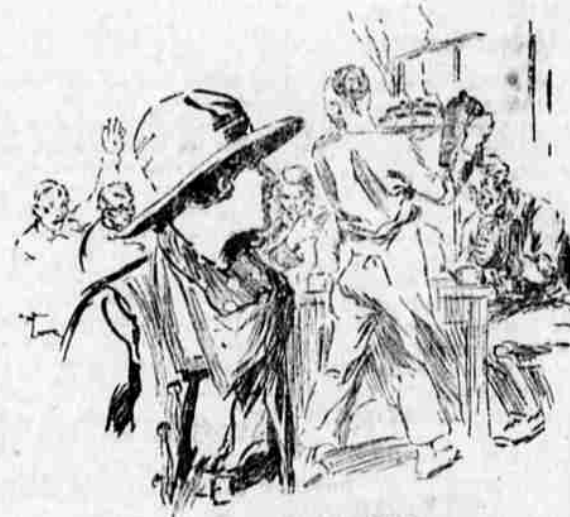
