Prisoner Too Fat To Wedge In Jail Cell

Smashes Scales When Attempt to Weigh Is Made

PRESSBURG, Hungary, Apr. 1. (P)—When the police arrested the former Roumanian deputy, Theophil Barescu, for embezzlement, they found that they had their hands full in the truest sense of the term. The prisoner's proportions and avoirdupois were so generous that when he was to be weighed, according to the prevailing custom for prisoners held on remand, the scales were promptly smashed. Not a single cell door proved large enough to admit a person of his dimensions. As it was not deemed advisable to fasten the prisoner to a tree outside doors, or to confine him in the prison garage, the warden graciously offered to have a space in his private apartment partitioned off for the defendant's interment until he should be brought up for trial.

Hold Conference; Bend Water Fuss

SALEM, Ore., April 1.—(P)—State Engineer Rhea Luper will leave today for Bend where he will confer with Bend officials of the Tumalo irrigation district relative to the Bend Municipal water supply. Under an act of the 1925 legislature the city claims the right to take from Tumalo creek for municipal purposes an amount of water equal to that appropriated from Deschutes river by the irrigation district. TARIFF BOARD TUFF CONTINUES

Deliberate Efforts to Break it Down Seen by Members of Body

WASHINGTON, April 1.—(P)—The tariff law has been "miserably administered" by the majority of the present tariff commission for the deliberate purpose of breaking it down, Commissioner Dennis, a democrat, charged today before the senate tariff investigating committee. The breakdown was attributed by Mr. Dennis to the bias of Chairman Marvin, backed up by Commissioners Glasie, Broussard and Baldwin. He accused the chairman of being "unfair" and having an obsession on the tariff question. "The tariff law and the tariff commission have broken down," he continued. "I believed in the law until six months ago, but since then I have no faith in the administration of the law by the present commission."
