GRIEF BESETS NEW AIR MAIL

One Pilot Lost, Another Forced Down When Engine Goes Dead

ELKO, Nev., April 7. — (AP) — Searchers for Franklin Rose, missing air mail pilot, who left here for Boise, Idaho, yesterday on the initial north trip of a contract air mail company, have traced him as far as White Rock, Nev., and 79 miles north of Tuscarora, an Indian village in Nevada.

Walter Varney, president of the company, said he believed Rose made a forced landing in the wilderness of Duck valley, in southwest Idaho, and that the pilot will be found safe and unharmed.

One automobile party left here early today and no word has been received from it. Roads in this section are almost impassable.

Word from Boise was that no trace of the missing pilot had been received there. One auto party is out and the ranger stations in the Humboldt national forest reported not having sighted the plane.

LA GRANDE, Ore., April 7. — (AP) — The Pasco-bound air mail plane made a forced landing here about 1:15 o'clock this afternoon when the engine "froze up" in mid-air.

The pilot made a safe landing. He is reported to have wired to headquarters for instructions.

RENO, Nev., April 7. — (AP) — S. C. Ciesler, general superintendent of the air mail, who is in Reno, sent a dispatch to Elko at 1 o'clock this afternoon, authorizing the use of a government plane at the Elko field, in the search for Franklin Rose, missing pilot.
