MUSSOLINI THE INVOLATE.

Benito Mussolini can well afford to spare the woman whose unsuccessful aim exalted him from ordinary hero to the sacrosanct ranks of that "divinity which doth hedge a king"—or a dictator. Emotional and superstitious Italians will see in his escape a new proof of the superhuman powers which render him invincible, says the Portland Telegram.

It was the backward thrust of his proud head, in the gesture with which he habitually meets the multitude, that foiled the attempt of the assassin. He has been saved from a new danger by the assured self confidence which has given him dominance in Italy.

He is not a demagogue to flatter and cajole, but a despot who assumes authority and enforces it by the mere weight of his personality. Whatever may be said of Fascism, the expression of a patriotism which curiously makes the abstract "patria"

superior to its people, no one can deny that Mussolini, the Fascist leader, is a man—of strength, of intelligence and courage.

After the war he found a people of a glorious past, faltering and falling in the chaos of a new industrialism, a kingdom not yet accustomed to unity, a tumultuous parliament backed by political parties too young to have developed stable principles or consistent adherents.

In this welter of disorder, he held up the Roman standard, emblem of nationality, supreme and united, which should assert itself above the clamor of conflicting interests. Fascism makes no pretense at democracy. It makes Italy supreme, but treats Italians with the disdain of a Nero. Only last month Mussolini said:

"Fascism has won because it has never tolerated any difference of opinion. Its block is monolithic. Fascism wins and will continue to win while it preserves this austere unitarian spirit, this religious obedience and this esthetic discipline. Its faith is not relative, but absolute."

It is officially stated that Fascism is so generally accepted as to make easy appeal to the nation quite superfluous. Since all are satisfied (or silenced), why bother with elections?

Fascist Italy prides itself on its Roman renaissance, but it revives the empire rather than the republic, and it may be reminded that the fall of the empire was so complete that after centuries it remains but a memory, a frail foundation for the Fascist state—which even now quivers with anti-Fascist agitation.

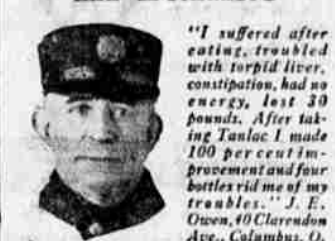

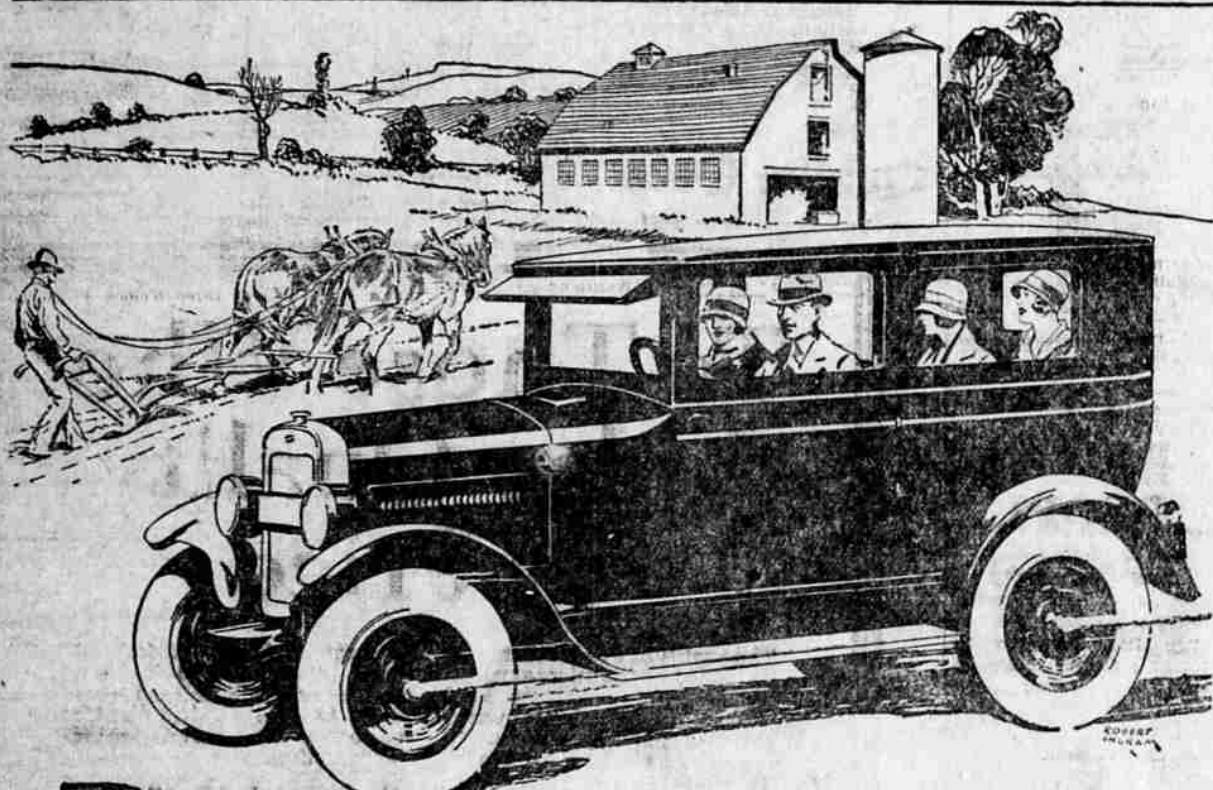
