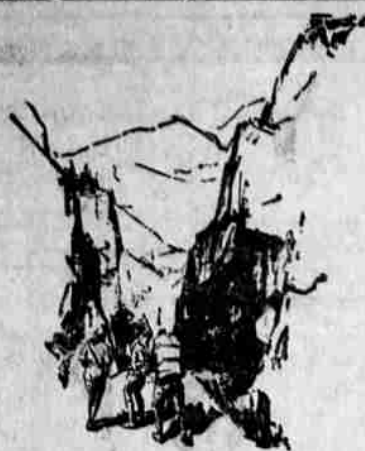

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NEW MOVE WILL BE GREAT HELP TO POTATO MEN

Adequate Storage for Local
Crop to be had Through
Bin Construction

Two potato warehouses in the farming district of Klamath county are now assured, through the efforts of a number of growers, co-operating with Jack H. Grafton, potato dealer. This was made certain with the completing of arrangements late yesterday, and the deeding of two one-acre tracts to Mr. Grafton for the purpose.

The first tract, donated by A. R. "Orb" Campbell and Roy Kinsman of Pine Grove, lies along the Strahorn railroad, while the other, furnished by Robt. Cheyne, lies at the intersection of The Dalles-California highway and Modoc Northern survey, below Mt. Laki.

On each tract Mr. Grafton will erect a modern potato storage cellar, approximately 40 by 150 feet, to be about four feet underground and eight feet above. Each cellar will have a driveway and entrance at each end, and will be equipped with machinery needed for handling, storing and shipping potatoes. A \$500 potato sorter will be installed here by Mr. Grafton, for the use of local growers.

Fill Urgent Storage Need
"This potato cellar has been found in older potato centers to be the most economical and satisfactory type," Mr. Grafton said today. "The establishment of these two cellars here will accomplish two things for Klamath county growers. First, an outlet for potatoes through our marketing organization will be assured; and much needed storage facilities will be provided. They will be merely a forerunner of a large warehouse which we plan to build here in a year or two."

Each cellar will have a capacity of 25 carloads of potatoes, making a total of 50 cars. This will care for nearly one third of the county's crop, which last year amounted to approximately 150 cars. Potatoes will be hauled directly from the fields and stored in aerated bins, without being sacked or re-handled, according to the plans. It is stated storage for the full season will be afforded to growers for \$20 per carload.

Mr. Grafton leaves this afternoon for Redmond after spending ten days here, buying, sorting and shipping 20 cars of local potatoes.

Briand Sees No Menace In Italian Move

PARIS, April 23. —(AP)—It was by friendly means and in a spirit of conciliation that Italy and her chief, Mussolini, tried to realize their legitimate aspirations, Premier Briand stated in chamber of deputies today in reply to a socialist interpellation. Italy does not wish to disturb European peace, Briand said he believed.

"Between Italy and France there is no irreducible opposition of interests," he continued; "we have great numbers of Italians on our soil and in the countries under our control. All are active workers to whom we have no reproach to make from an administrative viewpoint."

"Come amongst us—you will be received as racial brothers who mixed your blood with ours on the battle fields. I see a great future of collaboration between our countries without a hitch."

The chamber applauded. "We have certain problems to solve," M. Briand resumed. "We shall solve them amicably. I see nothing which can disturb the relations of the two countries. Our foreign policy is directed constantly by this consideration, without excluding that of vigilance. France, in the present state of Europe and of the world, will constantly be a pacifying agent."

Replying to an interpellation concerning the league of nations policy the premier said the recent assembly had shown that there were no "small peoples" left; and that any nation might assert its will, before which all ought to bow.

"The spirit of equality of the league of nations makes progress daily," he asserted. "Events, far from shaking confidence in the league, tend rather to confirm it."

"The nation which is provisionally kept outside has not absented herself," he said with reference to Germany's acceptance of the invitation to collaborate with the commission which is to study revision of the league council.

Wool Price Very Quiet Market Stagnant as Buyers and Sellers Hold Off

BOSTON, April 23. —(AP)—The Commercial Bulletin tomorrow will say:

"The demand for wool is still confined within narrow bounds and usually is for small quantities, as well. Prices are hardly changed for the week, but are in buyer's favor. Manufacturers are giving the market no encouragement whatever, declaring that the situation in the goods market offers them no basis for enthusiasm."

"In the west buying has been scattered and no movement worthy of special note has taken place anywhere. The new clip wool prices

have changed little or not at all this week.

Foreign markets are generally steady.

"The rail and water shipments of wool from Boston from January 1, 1926, to April 22, 1926, inclusive, were 68,781,000 pounds against 51,936,000 pounds for the same period last year. The receipts from January 1, 1926, to April 22, 1926, inclusive, were 134,551,000 pounds against 105,722,300 pounds for the same period last year."
