**INVITATION OUT
TO ANOTHER NINE
IN LOCAL LEAGUE****Any Nearby Team Requested
to put in Bid; Weed
and Dunsmuir Out**

Invitation to any southern Oregon or northern California town to join as the sixth member of the inter-state baseball league, formed last night, was extended by Paul Armstrong, league president, according to word received here today.

Either Weed or Dunsmuir are expected to accept the invitation. Ashland, has definitely decided to remain out of baseball because of lack of a baseball ground. First town to accept the invitation will be admitted.

At a meeting on the crest of the Siskiyou mountains, at Summit Inn, a five team league composed of Yreka, Mt. Shasta, Medford, Grants Pass and Klamath Falls was formed and Armstrong named as president. Next Tuesday, a supplemental meeting will be held to arrange schedules and details of the inter-state ball circuit.

Weed and Dunsmuir representatives were conspicuous by their absence. No reason was given for their lack of representation.

If the invitation is not accepted, the five-team league will be carried through.

New system of gate receipts division was affected at the meeting. Sixty per cent of the receipts will go to the home team and 40 per cent to the visitors. Under this system, followed in professional baseball, the stronger towns are able to carry the weaker towns through the season financially.

The meeting was amicable. Yreka and Mt. Shasta representatives, stated they were ready to stand behind the inter-state ball circuit plan, particularly under 40-60 per cent gate receipt plan.

"We learned that the other four teams were going to have strong nines this year", Bert Cook, director said today. "It will be a real league this year, one that has had no equal in this circuit."

**Geese Flying
Back To North**

Gigantic V's Wing Way
Over Klamath Falls
Each Morning

In gigantic V's great flocks of geese are winging their way from Klamath back to the far north, from whence they came last fall.

Each morning, from shortly after daybreak to 7 o'clock, flock after flock may be seen flying over Klamath like large squadrons of airplanes and their honking is heard for miles.

The geese are coming from Tule lake and their departure is bringing sighs of relief from farmers of the Tule lake section. According to report, thousands settle in Tule lake fields and consume new grain as it pushes its way up through the soil.

The 1925-1926 duck and goose season is without precedent. Instead of continuing their southward flight into California, the game birds, undisturbed by snow, remained in Tule lake. Now with the first warm days of spring, they are winging their way back to the north.

The geese, whose cackling as they crossed over Klamath Falls has disturbed the slumber of many a citizen, are for the most part speckled brants geese, cacklers and snow geese.
