Two fights of big-town calibre are now assured Klamath Falls boxing fans as a result of the positive assertion today by Benny Dotson, Portland flash, that he would remain here and fight either Kid Starkey or Frankie Lewis, depending upon which is the winner in the 10-round go this coming Tuesday night at Scandia Hall.

Fans are more than usually interested in seeing what will happen when Kid Starkey and Lewis cross gloves.

On the last card, before a crowd which was altogether too small, Lewis made a friend and a booster of everyone present who saw him rip into Trambitas with slashing rights and lefts.

Starkey already had friends here and he still has them. All want to see him win over Lewis so that he can have another chance at Dotson. Without detracting from Dotson's victory, most of them are certain that their next encounter will go a longer route and perhaps have a much different ending.

In the semi-windup on the coming card, hard-hitting Billy Huff will try a comeback with slugging Fred Greenlee as his opponent. Judging from the casual manner in which Greenlee made hash of Spec Woods, Huff will be entitled to plenty of credit if he can stay the route.

Spec Woods, all patched up from his fight with Greenlee, will try to score a win in his four-round contest with Jimmy Harms, new to local fans, but with a reputation in Southern California.

He is a brother of Billy Harms, an experienced ring man, and slated to hand Woods about the same brand of trouble as was dished up by Greenlee.

Participants in the four-round preliminary are yet to be chosen.

Public workouts to give fans a chance to look the boys over, are being held each evening at Scandia Hall at 6:30.

Kid Starkey has broken the training habits of a lifetime and is now boxing in his workouts. He is in first-class shape and working for a win over Lewis to give him a chance at Dotson, the first boxer ever to hand him the KO punch.

Wilbur Harrington was scheduled to go on, but refused to fight Harms who outweighed him two pounds.

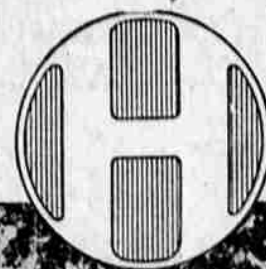

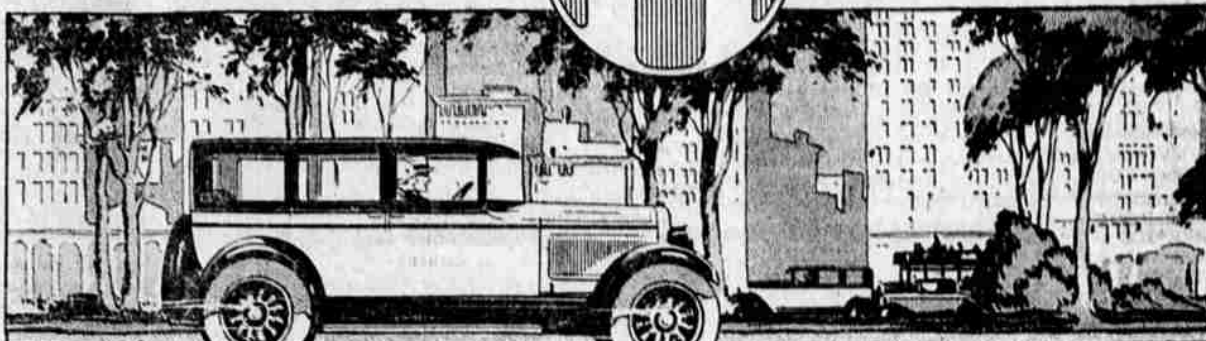

Debt Fund Plans Near Completion

WASHINGTON, April 28. —(AP)—Rapid strides toward solution of America's debt funding problems were shown today despite the temporary lull in the renewed French negotiations with approval of the Belgian agreement by a decisive vote late yesterday on the heels of its ratification of the Italian pact, the senate had cleared its calendar of the two settlements which have aroused the most vigorous objections thus far and was ready to dispose of the Latvian, Rumanian, Czechoslovakian and Estonian pending arrangements.
