Calkins put up a modern gas station, outfitted with the latest thing in gas service appliances, and also a brick building in which he planned to carry on his tire selling business.

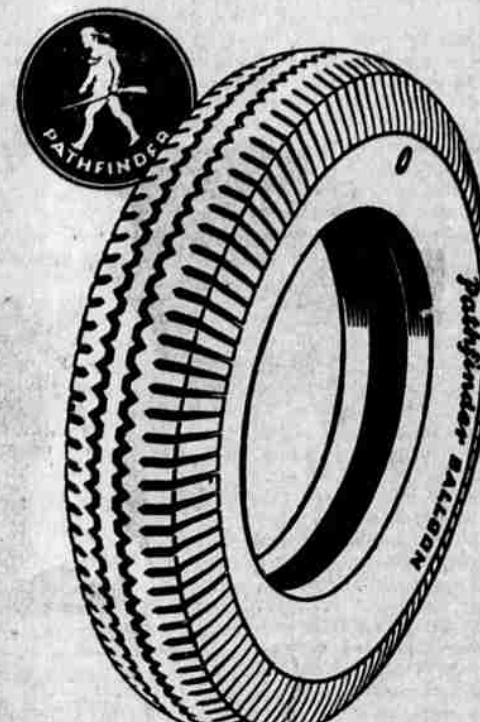
But a few days before he moved his gas station was purchased by
