English Wool Not U. S. Price Maker

DENVER, May 7.—(AP)—Due to the lateness of the shearing season in both Wyoming and Montana, marketing of the spring wool clip will not be affected seriously by disruption of the English wool market only in the event that the strike is of long duration; in the opinion of leading flock masters of the two states. Shearing is not yet under way in either state, the major shearing season coming in June. Approximately 2,000,000 pounds of an estimated clip of 23,000,000 pounds have been contracted in Wyoming, most of the contracting having been done in March and early April. None has been reported in the last thirty days. Prices have ranged from 32c to 35c a pound peak.

Very little wool has been contracted in Montana up to the present, the few contracts which have been made being at 35 cents. Thirty-eight cents has been offered in a few cases, livestock men near Billings report.
