SUMMONS

To the defendants J. D. Edler, A. E. Smith and H. E. Childers:
In the Name of the State of Oregon: You and each of you are hereby required to appear and answer the Answer and Cross-complaint of the defendants T. V. Mulkey and Lakeview Mercantile Co., a corporation, filed against you in the above entitled Court and cause on or before the 7th day of May, 1926, said date being the last day of the publication of this summons, and the last day within which you are required to appear and answer said Answer and Cross-complaint, as fixed by the Court order for the publication of this summons. If you fail to so appear and answer, said defendants T. V. Mulkey and Lakeview Mercantile Co. will apply to the above entitled court for the relief prayed for and demanded in their said Answer and Cross-complaint, to wit:

For a decree adjudging and decreeing: That the defendant T. V. Mulkey do have and recover of and from the defendant J. D. Edler the sum of \$3,750.00, with interest thereon at the rate of eight per cent per annum from the fourth day of October, 1922, until paid; that the defendant Lakeview Mercantile Co. do have and recover of and from the defendant J. D. Edler the sum of \$1,000.00, with interest thereon at the rate of eight per cent per annum from the fourth day of October, 1922, until paid; that the defendants T. V. Mulkey and Lakeview Mercantile Co. jointly do have and recover of and from the defendant J. D. Edler the sum of \$500.00, as attorney's fees in this suit, and their costs and disbursements incurred herein; to be taxed; that the said sums for attorney's fees and costs and disbursements shall bear interest at the rate of eight per cent per annum from the date of the judgment therefor until paid;

That the mortgage given by the defendant J. D. Edler to the defendants T. V. Mulkey and Lakeview Mercantile Co., dated the fourth day of October, 1922, and recorded on the eleventh day of October, 1922, Book 28, beginning on page 245. Records of real property mortgages of Klamath County, Oregon, and set forth in full in the Answer and Cross-complaint of the defendants T. V. Mulkey and Lakeview Mercantile Co. Company on file herein, be decreed to be a valid and subsisting lien, prior in time and superior in right to any right, title, estate, lien, claim, or interest of each of the defendants J. D. Edler, A. E. Smith, and H. E. Childers, upon the real property therein, and hereinafter described, to secure the payment of the sums which may herein be decreed due the defendants T. V. Mulkey and Lakeview Mercantile Co.; that said mortgage be foreclosed and the real property covered thereby be sold in the manner provided by law and the proceeds of such sale be applied to the satisfaction of the sums which may herein be decreed due the defendants T.
