

Hold Couple on Serious Charge

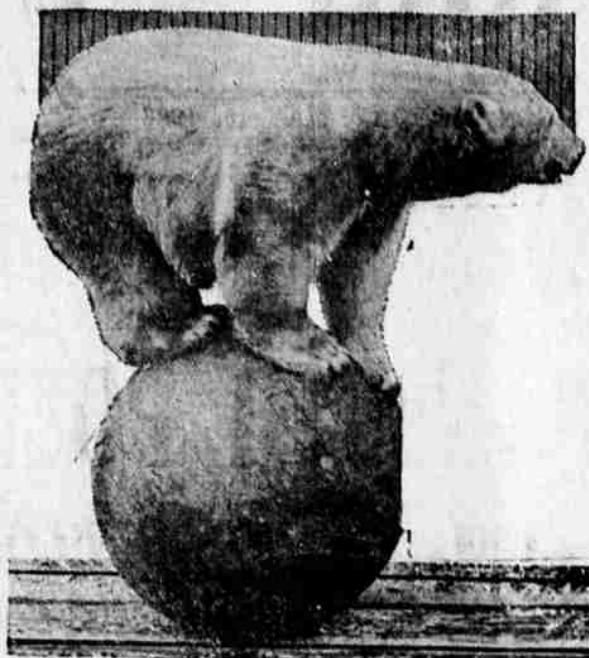

Circus Arrives—and All Kids Seem to Realize It



Al G. Barnes circus arrived this morning and despite the early hour those engaged in unloading the equipment had a large audience. All the boys in town seemed to know about it, and ranks of the boys were augmented by about one-fourth the male population of Klamath Falls.

In addition to the afternoon show, expected to draw a record crowd, another performance will be given at 8 o'clock tonight.

"A glittering spectacle of golden glory," sounds like an old circus proverb. Yet it is true, when apomster tents and the trains of here. Those in Klamath Falls who have been used to attending circus performances year in and year out, recall the former days when Barnes introduced wild animal acts almost exclusively. Now the animal acts are given just the same. Barnes, however, has crowded into the space of time allotted to the circus program, many other distinct and novel features.

This spectacular opening is only a "bracer" for the big things to follow. Of the aerial numbers, perhaps the greatest hit is Barnes' flying ballet of 15 girls on electric ladders. The Torneaux group of flying trapeze artists is good.

The Pina family are sensational wire walkers and Slayman Ben Hadj All are tumblers and pyramid builders.

The trained animal division is principally directed by Louis Roth, a veteran of the Barnes organization, and the group of lions, tigers and pumas go through acts as though they were human beings. Frank Laggett's elephants are another group of actors.

Everything connected with the enterprise is spick and span new. The show gives performances again at 8 o'clock tonight.

118 PARIS COPS HURT IN RIOTING

Royalists Numbering 150 Injured in Attempt to Honor Joan of Arc

PARIS, May 10. (AP)—There was fierce fighting in two sections of Paris between royalists and the police yesterday when royalists marched to two statues of Joan of Arc to lay wreaths. The casualties were 118 policemen and about 150 royalists injured.

Notwithstanding the strong forces of police which had been mobilized to prevent the royalists from disobeying an order of Minister of the Interior Durand against formal processions to the monuments, they forced their way through police tribunals at the bases of both statues.

In front of the historic church of St. Roch in the Rue St. Honore there was a lively clash in view of the congregation. The royalists sang "Long live the king; down with the republic."

When the police began to use their clubs those on the steps of the church hissed and shouted "down with the republic."

The police finally cleared the church steps, but not without vigorous protests. The other clash occurred in Place St. Augustine.

It read: "The committee is delighted that your performance will make you one of the foremost navigators in history, and that you, an American, will find your name high on the list of world explorers."
