## Carpentier to Make Another Ring Attempt

### Meets Eddie Huffman Tonight in N. Y. Ring

NEW YORK, May 21.—(AP)—Handsome Georges Carpentier of France tonight makes another effort in the ring.

The former light heavyweight champion of the world, veteran of the world war, who has been a pugilist since he was 13 years old, will tackle Sailor Eddie Huffman of the Pacific coast in a ten-round contest at Madison Square Garden.

Georges is 32 years old. In all of his battles he has given weight to opponents. Four times he has gone before the American public; only once has he been victorious. That was against Battling Levinsky.

When he returned to America last summer, he said that he would not accept challenges to box. But he was lured and a victory tonight will place him in line for another chance at the light heavyweight crown.

Huffman is a rugged, upstanding fighter, shifty, but lacking the speed of the Frenchman, he has been an "in and out" in his bouts in the east.

Boxing followers favor the chances of gorgeous Georges, who has trained faithfully for two months in Atlantic City. They argue that he may have lost some of his speed, but that he still possesses the weapon that nearly shook the heavyweight crown from the head of Dempsey at Boyles Thirty Acres, a lightning right hand.
