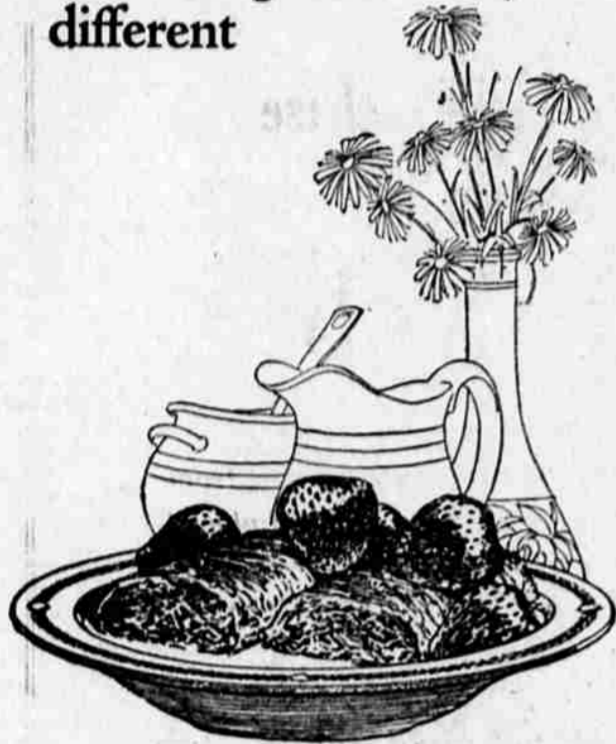

NINE KLAMATH STUDENTS IN MILITARY TOURNAMENT



MOTORIZED FIELD ARTILLERY AT TOURNAMENT

OREGON AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE, Corvallis, May 21. — Nine Klamath Falls students will take part in several events of the fourteenth annual military tournament at O. A. C. May 29. By means of the tournament the military department each year shows the training it offers and the serious purpose the physically fit men of the college give to their work in the reserve corps.

Robert E. Murphy, Kenneth Case, Harry E. Peltz, John R. Montgomery and Samuel G. Smith of the infantry unit are entered in the company drill and the review. Edwin Fargo will act as a cannoneer in the field artillery exhibition, while Herbert E. Landis and LeRoy C. Wright are entered in the regimental review. Julian Ager will compete in the sack race, a feature of the tournament. Melvin Moyer of Merrill and Lawrence Cardwell of Fort Klamath are entered in the close order exhibition

drill of a crack infantry company. The opening event of the tournament will be an air service demonstration beginning at 1 o'clock, directed by Lieutenant Oakley G. Kelly America's premier long distance flying ace. The air demonstration, to be an outstanding event of the tournament, will include formation and stunt flying and a parachute drop.

A review of all units of the reserve corps will follow the air demonstration. Other events scheduled include construction by an engineering unit of a pontoon bridge in a combat situation and its destruction by explosives; a pony express race; a machine gun contest; mounted contest; a women's feature ride; the closing ceremonial retreat parade of all military posts and feature stunts. All grammar and high school students of Oregon will be admitted free. It was announced by Major Donald A. Robinson, tournament director.

Bandits Free Army Captain
U. S. Officer Released by Chinese Robber Band

PEKING, May 21. (AP) — After two days captivity in the hands of bandits in northern Yunnan province, one of the most remote parts of China, Captain Thomas J. Betts, United States army, is again a free man; the American Legation was informed today.

Myrl S. Myers, United States consul at Yunnan-Fu, telegraphed the legation he had been advised by the local magistrate of Laitowpo, scene of Captain Betts' capture that the bandits had released their prisoner on May 19. Laitowpo is a small town about 100 miles north of Yunnan-Fu.

Captain Betts, attached to the American legation for study of Chinese, was making a journey from French Indo-China to the Yangtze across one of the districts of China least traveled by foreigners.

Information travels slowly in China, even by telegraph, and Yunnan is the most remote province from Peking. Hence it appears that Captain Betts was freed before the American legation was informed of his capture and began to seek his release.
