SIX DEATHS IN SOUTHERN RAIN

Wall of Water Claims Five
Drowned from one Family
in Cloudburst

PAWTHUSKA, Okla., June 3. (AP)—Six persons were dead today as a result of a storm that swept over northern Oklahoma last night, according to reports reaching here. Five of the victims were drowned and the other struck by lightning. Those drowned were all members of one family. The dead:

F. L. Blocher, 45; Mrs. F. L. Blocher, 35; Mrs. Ruth Bailey, 21; Belle Ruth Bailey, 7 months; Lillie Blocher, 6, all of Hominy; Albert L. Adams, 25, of Drumright.

The members of the Blocher family were drowned when a fourfoot wall of water rushed down Rock creek, two miles south of Hominy, washing away an approach to a bridge as the auto in which they were riding neared it.

Hearing the roar of the approaching wall of water, Blocher speeded up his car in an attempt to cross the stream before the rise struck the bridge.

CREWS PREPARE LOCAL ROAD FOR OILING PROGRAM

Carload of oil Already here;
Algoma-Klamath Work
Slated to go First

State highway from Algoma to Klamath Falls, 12 miles, is being prepared for oiling by a maintenance crew. It was announced this morning by state highway engineers.

The road is being scraped and sprinkled in order to get it in proper condition for the state highway oiling crew which is expected within the next two weeks.

Charles Wanzer, Bend, division engineer in charge of state highway in this section, has ordered one carload of oil for this section of road. The car will be located one-half mile north of Pelican City for distribution.

Other sections of highway to be oiled this summer are as follows: The Dalles-California highway from Klamath Falls south to the Lakeview highway junction; The Ashland-Klamath Falls highway west from Klamath Falls to Keno.

COYOTE INVASION SHOWS INCREASE

Bonanza District Alive with
Pests, Report of Trapper
Who Gets 28

Coyotes by the hundred are invading the Bonanza country. Dry weather has started the predatory

beasts from their spring habitat on the reservation and in the lava beds, to the higher mountainous country in the region of Bonanza.

This is the word received at the county agent's office today by County Agent C. A. Henderson, from H. H. Gubser, trapper for the U. S. Biological survey.

Gubser reported that during the past month he had trapped and poisoned 28 coyotes and three bob cats in the Bonanza country.

Because there has been no predatory animal control on the reservation, or in the lava beds, the beasts have been increasing, Gubser said. As a result the annual migration into Klamath farm lands and sheep grazing sections is more serious this year than usual.
