### GAME BODIES TO MEET SUNDAY AT HORN BROOK, CAL.

#### Sportsmen From Northern California Will Attend Important Meeting

(Special to The Herald)  
YREKA, Calif., June 7.—Members of the Oregon Fish commission and the Fish and Game commission of California, will meet at Hornbrook next Sunday to discuss trout. It is planned by the California board to hold young trout in hatching ponds until they are five inches long instead of turning them out as fingerlings, two inches long, as at present. It is believed that this plan will soon result in trout of California multiplying by three.

It is already a law in Oregon that the small trout hatched in state tanks must be kept there until they are large enough to take care of themselves.

Before going south to meet the Oregon board members the California commissioners will be banqueted Saturday night at Dunsmuir by the Siskiyou County Sportsmen's association at a fish dinner.

Sportsmen from Weed, Yreka, Etna, McCloud, Mt. Shasta and Dunsmuir will be present.

The California board is headed by I. Zellerbach.

### Modification Looms As Big Issue In Ohio

#### Pomerene to go to Polls On Question, Is Belief

COLUMBUS, O., June 7. (AP)—Possibility of modification of the Volstead prohibition law becoming a dominant issue in the election of a United States senator in the Buckeye state this fall was foreseen by political leaders here today in the entrance of Former Senator Alton Pomerene into the race for the democratic senatorial nomination.

The only possible contingent it was contended will be the ability of Mr. Pomerene to win the nomination over other democratic entries. Renomination of Senator Frank D. Willis by the republicans generally is conceded. He is a champion of prohibition and the Volstead law. Mr. Pomerene is considered a liberal, so much so that Attorney Frank F. Centoch of Cleveland, who had announced his candidacy on a platform of opposition to prohibition withdrew from the race simultaneously with Mr. Pomerene's announcement last evening, that he is a candidate.

Mr. Pomerene will have at least one formidable contender for the nomination—Judge Florence E. Allen of the state supreme court. She declares that she will not vacate the field in favor of the former democrat.

A crowd estimated at 30,000 was at Latonia today to witness the running of the historic Latonia derby over a lightning fast track and with weather conditions ideal.
