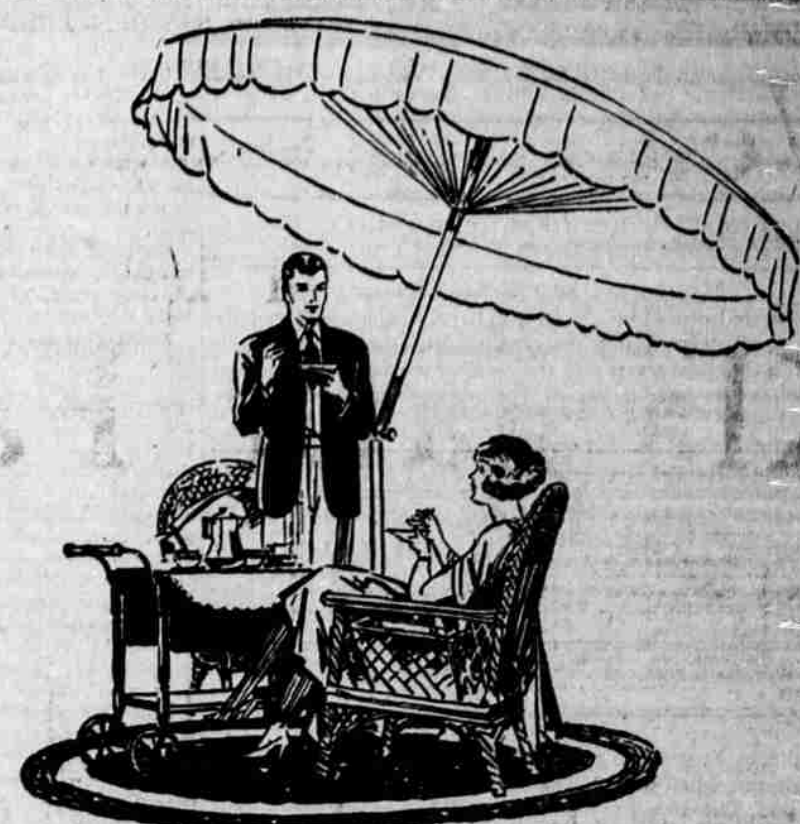
ARLETT LEADING COAST SLUGGERS
