**Many Fires Break
Out in Washington**
WASHINGTON, June 10. (A)
Reports of thirty one forest fires on
five national forests in California
and the droughty conditions of some
parts of the country at present caused
W. B. Greeley, chief forester of
the forest service today to ask pub-
lic cooperation in prevention work.
A telegram from the San Fran-
cisco headquarters of the service
said a fire season had opened ac-
tively.
The forest service has called out
its reserve guards in the dangerous
regions, and has asked the public to
guard against careless acts which
would start fires.
