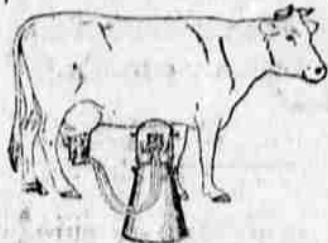


**LEFT FOR PORTLAND**
