ALBANY, Ore., June 21. — (AP) — Robert D. Evans, 27, Eugene, Ore., fireman on a local Southern Pacific freight train, was killed, and Clarence Mickle, fireman of Albany, suffered a fractured ankle in a collision of two freight trains a mile south of Albany late Saturday night.

Evans jumped as the crash impended and a freight car which left the rails fell on him, crushing him.
