

STARKEY-DOTSON FIGHT IS A DRAW

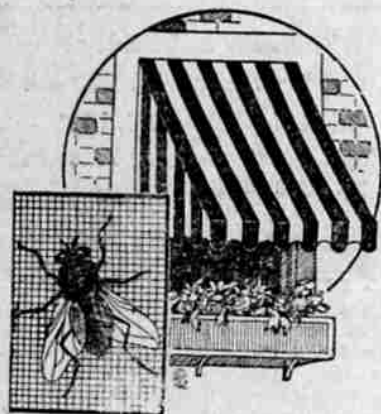

SHIPS CRASH IN MOUNTED POLICE MYSTERY WRECK BAR SMUGGLERS

Portland Scene of Strange Disaster; Pilots at Fault Not Revealed

PORTLAND, Ore., June 30.—(AP)—The McCormick Steamship Coastwise Steamers Newport and Edna, crashed head-on directly under the new Burnside bridge at 10:25 today, the former sustaining damage to the extent of approximately \$45,000. Eight or ten of her bow plates were badly damaged below the water line.

The Newport, newly added to the McCormick line, which was scheduled to sail for San Francisco Friday, will be unable to leave. Repairs are expected to be made at once.

There has been no reason forthcoming for the accident.

There is ample room for both ships to pass through simultaneously.

The pilot's office refused to name the pilots aboard the vessel.

Large Force Will Patrol the Border to Aid U. S. in Patrolling Large Area

OTTAWA, June 30.—(AP)—Royal Canadian mounted police are being stationed at all vulnerable points on the Canadian border from the Atlantic to Pacific to aid in the prevention of smuggling. Announcement to this effect was made today by the acting minister of customs, H. H. Stevens. The action comes as an immediate sequel to the adoption by the house of commons this morning of the report of parliamentary investigation into customs frauds. The mounted police are definitely instructed to co-operate with all customs and preventive officers.

Mr. Stevens declared that there will be a complete reorganization and strengthening of the preventive service in accordance with the report of the investigation committee.

WASHINGTON, June 30.—(AP)—Strengthening of the border patrol by Canada will be followed next week by addition of more than 100 men along the Canadian border by this government.

The new United States forces will be stationed as soon as the funds are provided in the second deficiency appropriation bill pending in the senate become available. The bulk of the new forces will be centered about Detroit, where 37 new men will be placed. Assistant Secretary Andrews, in charge of prohibition enforcement, declared today that this point is the biggest leak from Canada. Only 3 agents are now stationed there.

Grenada in Siskiyou county, George Wilson, a drafted fire fighter, was burned to death in Guy gulch, and a companion, Thomas Baker of Galle was badly burned.

Sixty lightning fires were reported burning in Sequoia national forest. None of them are serious. One hundred and thirty five men were fighting a fire in the Big Creek district in Madera county, and 14 other fires were reported in the county. A fire on Crooks mountain was still out of control last night after burning over 6,500 acres. Employees of the Madera Sugar Pine company were fighting a fire on Taylor mountain which had covered 3,500 acres of brush lands and was threatening one of the camps of the company.

Many of the fires started in the storm were put out without damage by rain which accompanied the lightning.

Four hundred men were recruited by the forest service to fight a fire in the Yosemite valley. Much valuable timber was threatened.
