La Barba Holds Champ Honors

LOS ANGELES, July 8 — (AP)—Fidel La Barba, king of the fly-weight boxers, today was among the battered thinned ranks of title-holders, who, in this age of upsets in championship row, have repulsed successfully the fighting bids of their challengers.

In a fast and furious ten round battle here last night the champion took a referee's decision over G. Rivers of San Francisco and Los Angeles.

To those who had seen La Barba in his previous fights, the battle he waged last night came as a surprise for he discarded the defensive tactics he usually employed and fought a purely offensive fight throughout.

It was estimated that between 7,500 and 8,000 fans saw the scrap. The champion was guaranteed 47 per cent of the total receipts which were estimated at \$32,000. Rivers got 15 per cent.

WINTER WHEAT CROP DAMAGED

LA GRANDE, Ore., July 8 (AP)—With the main harvest of winter wheat in Union and Walla Walla counties due to begin about July 20, ten days earlier than ordinary, county agent H. G. Avery estimates that the yield in Union county will be slightly below normal. Before the spring freezes a crop 25 per cent above normal was expected.

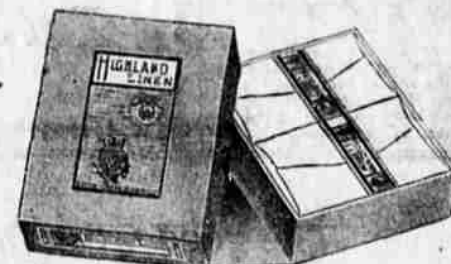
