

Anglo-French Pact Signed

Debt Settlement Passed Upon by Nations

LONDON, July 14.—(AP)—The settlement signed in London yesterday by Finance Minister Caillaux covers not only the French war debt but virtually all the outstanding accounts between Great Britain and France. Announcement to this effect was made in the house of commons today by Chancellor of the Exchequer Winston Churchill.

The French payments, he said, would be 4,000,000 pounds, 6,000,000 pounds and 10,000,000 pounds, rising to 12,000,000 pounds annually, the last named figure being reached in 1930.

From 1930 to 1936, the payment would be 12,500,000 annually rising to 14,000,000 pounds for the final 21 years.

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NEW CAR AGENCY OPENING TODAY

Oregon-California Garage to Handle Chandlers and Cleverlands Here

Today marks the official entrance of a new Klamath automobile company into the local sales field, with S. E. Anderson and W. S. Conkling of the Oregon-California highway garage holding an official opening to celebrate their securing of the Cleverland and Chandler agencies.

The firm, with showrooms and shops at 423 South Sixth street, has secured as salesmanager L. E. Snodgrass, for three years with the Topsy Lumber company at Dorris.

On exhibition this evening will be the 43 Cleverland sedan, the 31 Cleverland sedan, the Cleverland 43 coupe and the Chandler 20th century sedan.

Prices on the cars to be exhibited range from \$1355 for the Cleverland 31 sedan to \$1925 for the Chandler 20th century sedan. Price of the Cleverland standard touring, the lowest priced car in the line, is \$1135, but none of these will be shown at the opening.

Features of the standard equipment on both cars include the famous one-shot oiling system, whereby one push on a foot plunger sends oil at 1000 pounds pressure to every chassis bearing. Motometers, automatic windshield wipers, balloon tires and trunk racks are standard equipment, together with four wheel brakes and automatic take-up on all shackles, eliminating

all chance of rattles developing in the car.

And finally, the cars have the famous Pike's Peak motor, which according to Anderson has the world's record for efficiency.

To prove it, he quotes these records recently established by the car: 1000 miles in 745 minutes. This is the fastest time ever made by a motor car without stopping the engine.

Record up Mt. Diablo in California—22 minutes, 36 3-5 seconds.

Record run between Salt Lake City, Utah, to Los Angeles, California. Time 20 hours, 2 minutes.

Speed climb record up Mt. Wilson in California—24 minutes, 47.04 seconds.

Closed car record in the run from San Francisco, California, to Portland, Oregon, and return.

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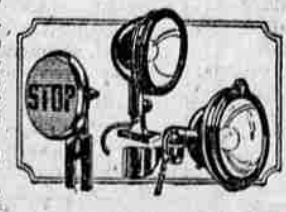
