## Delaney Popular Winner In Fight

### Real Name in Itself Enough to Win for Him

NEW YORK, July 17. — (P) — The world's light heavyweight ring crown, jolted from championship hands five times in the last six years, found a new resting place today atop the handsome countenance of Jack Delaney of Bridgeport, Conn., whose real name is Chapdelaine Ovide.

A sensational victory under the unanimous decision of the judges

brought the roving gladiator to Delaney before a capacity throng of 45,000 which paid \$129,000 to see the rivals of two years standing battle at Ebbets field for the third time. The verdict for Delaney, who only seven months before had failed to lift the championship from his rugged rival, was as popular as only such a victory could be for a ring warrior who had gathered around him probably the greatest following of any challenger since the days of Knockout Brown, and it came as a triumph over a tremendous weight advantage, surmounted despite the handicap of a small loss in his left hand during the second round.

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## New Ideas Shown In Latest Oldsmobile Displayed Here

Progressive developments of Oldsmobile engineers during the past year are being displayed throughout the country for the first time in the new series "E" Oldsmobile.

One new body type is on display in the Oldsmobile series "E" line—the Landau. Other body types in the line remain the same, including the standard and deluxe touring, deluxe roadster, standard and deluxe coupe, standard and deluxe coach and the standard and deluxe sedan—a total of ten including the Landau. No change has been made in the standard Oldsmobile prices.

Added power has been given Oldsmobile by increasing the cylinder bore from 2 3/4 inches to 2 7/8 inches with a resulting increase in cubic displacement from 169 to 185 cubic inches, a slight change in the tapered, dome-shaped combustion chamber and a new hot section, high velocity design of manifold.

Improvements vital to the longer life and operating economy of the engine have been made with the introduction of crankcase ventilation, dual-air cleaning, an oil filter and an entirely new design of "two-way" cooling system.

All these improvements increase the operating efficiency of the Oldsmobile and prolong its engine life.

A new high velocity, hot section manifold is a part of the improved design in the new Oldsmobile. This design retains the high velocity given on the incoming gases as they leave the carburetor and pass on into the combustion chambers. An improved jacketing of the inlet manifold by the heated exhaust manifold is effected in the vertical section above the carburetor and assists in more complete vaporization of the fuel. The inlet manifold, being above the exhaust manifold and heated by it, retains the highly explosive state of incoming gases. This new design contributes to the still smoother performance of this new Oldsmobile and to its greater operating economy.

Numerous refinements have added to its appearance and to the comfort

and convenience of driver and passengers. The more massive lines given by the raising and broadening of the radiator shell are further emphasized by new heavy full crown fenders which beautify the car and reduce the splash of water.

Indirect lighting is a feature of the new walnut finished instrument panel by which all the instruments, artistically grouped, are individually and indirectly illuminated at night without glare. This panel includes, besides the conventional speedometer, oil gauge and ammeter, a fuel gauge, carburetor choke button and a combination ignition switch and lock.

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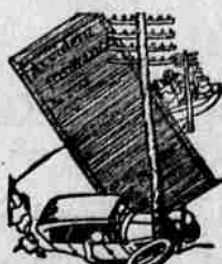
