

# COLUMBIA RIVER EXPEDITION ON HISTORIC SITE

### Students, Writers and Historians Visit Scene of Pioneer Activity

ASTORIA, Ore., July 21.—(P)—The Columbia River Historical expedition, composed of 150 writers, historians, high school students and others who, on Thursday, will dedicate a monument here to pioneers of the Pacific northwest, reached the end of their long overland journey early today when two special trains arrived at Seaside on the Pacific coast.

The expedition, sponsored by Vincent Astor and the Great Northern railway, officially ended its trek within a short distance of the spot where the followers of Lewis and Clark evaporated ocean water to secure salt for the return trip to civilization.

After being welcomed by a party of Astoria and Seaside citizens, including Miss Columbia and her entourage, the visitors dedicated a monument on the site of the salt earns, one of the few physical

traces left by early explorers on the coast. Governor Walter M. Pierce of Oregon presided at the ceremonies.

The remainder of the day was largely one of rest for members of the expedition. Many of them came to Astoria to witness the "spirit of the west" parade, which was the high point in today's program of the three-day celebration of Astoria's founding.

Miss Columbia, who in every day life is Betty Bestul, was inaugurated as ruler of the festivities in elaborate ceremonies last night before several thousand persons. Surrounded by a bevy of court beauties and a retinue clad as Indians, trappers and sailors of the old clipper ship days, Miss Columbia sat in state while Charles W. Robinson, local attorney, attired as Captain Robert Gray, discoverer of the Columbia river, delivered the inaugural address. Later she was the guest of honor at an inaugural ball.

### Wool Prices on Slow Move Up

PORTLAND, Ore., July 21.—(P)—Sale of two clips of wool in the Baker section, aggregating approximately 225,000 pounds, at the 32 cent level, has boosted the market level in eastern Oregon.

Practically all of the choice wools in Oregon have now passed out of the growers' hands. About 260,000 pounds of wool, including some 1925 clips, is all that remains in the country.

LONDON, July 21.—(P)—There was a full attendance at the wool auction today, and offerings amounted to 12,273 bales. The market was slow and there were frequent withdrawals owing to the high limits asked by holders. Approximately nine thousand bales were sold.

LONDON, July 21.—(P)—Australia is set against wiles. When the Australian cricket team sailed for Great Britain, the Australian Cricket board of control put a ban on wives accompanying the members of the test team. And now the Australian branch of the Empire Parliamentary association has advised British parliamentarians who are to visit Australia soon that they are not expected to be accompanied by their wives.

J. H. Thomas and several of the other members of parliament have refused to make the trip because their wives are barred.

### Portland Ready For Greeting To State Merchants

### Annual Buyers' Week Expected to Attract Thousands

PORTLAND, July 21.—(Special.)—All is in readiness for the 14th annual buyers' week to be held August 2-7 in Portland, at which time 135 of the leading jobbers and manufacturers of this northwest metropolitan market will be hosts to the merchants of the fourteen western states, Alaska, British Columbia and the Hawaiian Islands.

One of the most interesting and unusual programs of entertainment ever staged for the benefit of merchants has been prepared by these hosts. From the time of their arrival until the last day, there will be something to attract their attention in the way of educational talks and fashion shows, interspersed with entertainment for the relaxation of the merchant.

Railroad fares will be refunded to merchants whose purchases aggregate five hundred dollars or more during this week.

Returns from merchants indicate a large attendance that will exceed all previous records. Cars of merchants will be met at the depot by special committees who will escort them to the various warehouses and manufacturing establishments immediately after registration at Buyer's Week Headquarters.

### Chinese Pickets Free Army Group

HONG KONG, July 21.—(P)—Two European police sergeants and four Chinese members of the Hong Kong police force were released today by Chinese pickets enforcing the Canton anti-British boycott, who had held them captive since early this week. The release was effected after a detachment of the British East Surrey regiment had been sent to find the missing men.

The policemen were captured when their motor boat went aground in the Samehum river, near here, during the floods of a few days ago.
