Lumber Company
Advances Money
For Road WorkCounty Will Reimburse
Firm When Funds
Are Secured

So anxious is the Algoma Lumber company to have a 3300-foot road constructed from The Dalles-California highway to Algoma station, that officials of the concern offered to pay for the entire project if the county court would pay them back 75 per cent of the total construction cost.

The county court lent a willing ear to the proposition and referred the matter to County Engineer Joseph Jensen who is figuring costs of the project.

"The road will be graded and surfaced and will entail an expenditure of approximately \$7,000", Mr. Jensen said this morning. "Apparently the court is planning to go through with the job. At first it demurred because of lack of available funds, but when the Algoma Lumber company offered to stand the entire cost until the county had funds to reimburse them, the court was willing to go ahead. The lumber company will pay for one quarter of the project."

Bernhardt Has
Odd Memorial

PRATTSBURG, N. Y., July 23. (AP)—An odd memorial to Sarah Bernhardt, French tragedienne, erected by a devoted admirer seven months after her death, stands in a little frequented spot near here, its existence unknown to the outside world.

The date of its erection, October 16, 1923, marked it among the first in this country.

The monument, composed of concrete blocks on a stone and cement base standing 14 feet high, was built by Charles D. Bean, a Geneva lawyer and descendant of Colonial settlers, who had followed her career in this country and the foreign capitals. Mr. Bean built the statue in the name of one of the oldest school societies in this country, the Knights of Cyprus, of which he is a trustee.

SALEM, Ore., July 23. — (AP) — Edward P. Cochran, father of John W. Cochran, deputy internal revenue collector, died at his home here at the age of 80 years.

Texas Negro Is
Solon's Opponent

TOPEKA, Kan., July 23. (AP)—A negro will be the only opponent of Senator Charles Curtis, Republican floor leader, who seeks party renomination for a third term in the August 3 Kansas primary. The negro is Nick Chiles, editor of a weekly newspaper in Topeka.

Senator Curtis has been twice re-elected.

The Democratic contest for senatorial nomination will be George McGill of Wichita and Charles Stephens of Columbus, both lawyers.

Former Gov. Jonathan M. Davis will attempt to return to political power. Democratic voters will find on their ballot the name of the farmer who was arrested two hours before he vacated the governor's chair early in 1925, charged with selling pardons, and later cleared by three juries. They will choose between him and a lawyer, Donald Muir of Anthony.

Governor Paulsen, republican, is opposed for renomination by Golden B. Davis, a farmer.
