KENNEBUNK, Port Me., July 27. (P)—Booth Tarkington, author, was recovering today from an adventure as exciting as any that have delighted the readers of "Penrod" or "Seventeen."

When his motorboat caught fire ten miles off the coast last night, the Indiana author was successively burned by the flames, swept to sea before a hurricane gale and then, as in all good story books, rescued in the nick of time.

BOGUS CREEK BLAZE RAGES

Moves Rapidly Forward on South Front, Report Here

Checked on the north but spreading rapidly on the south front, the huge Bogus creek forest fire, north-west of Macdoel, Siskiyou county, is still uncontrolled, according to a report received here today by a representative of the Klamath Forest Protective association to investigate the fire.

Timber holdings of the Algoma Box company in the Siskiyou section are being menaced as well as holdings owned by Richard Hovey, owner of large tracts of timber in Klamath.

According to unconfirmed report a part of the Algoma holdings have already been destroyed by the advancing wall of flames. The Hovey holdings are still intact.

What measures are being taken to control the blaze could not be learned. J. F. Kimball, secretary of the Klamath Forest Protective association, today wired to the district United States forester in San Francisco stating that the Bogus creek fire had rendered forest lookout work impossible.

Millions of feet of pine timber have been consumed by the terrific blaze, it was learned, and unless checked the conflagration will do untold damage.

Fear that the fire would destroy Klamath timber was lessened today when it was learned that the fire had apparently burned out on the northern front.

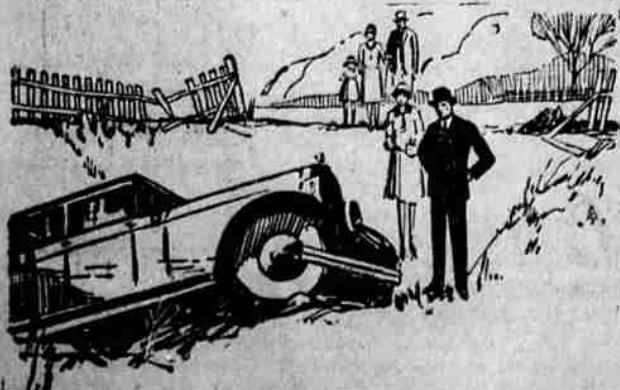

56 Per Cent Less Paying Income Tax

PORTLAND, Ore., July 23.—Statistics just compiled by Clyde G. Huntley, collector of internal revenue, reliably show the extent to which residents of this state were relieved from filing returns of income for the calendar year 1925, due to the provision in the 1926 revenue act substantially increasing the personal exemptions of both married and unmarried persons. These figures show a falling off of 56 per cent in the number of individual returns for 1925 compared with the number filed for the preceding year. Returns were filed by only 23,924 individuals on 1925 incomes as compared to 65,358 individuals for the year before.

Bonanza to Have \$5,000 Gymnasium

Construction of a \$500 high school gymnasium in Bonanza, financed through a bond issue, will start immediately and be completed by fall, it was announced this morning by County School Superintendent Fred Peterson.

Contract for the construction of the building has been let to the firm of Martin and Robertson. The bonds were sold to the Portland firm of Hettram and Nelson company, at five and one-half per cent interest and a premium of \$2.20 per \$100.
