Budlong Given Divorce Decree

PROVIDENCE, R. I., July 24.—(AP)—Milton J. Budlong, millionaire New York-Newport resident, and former head of the New York agency of the Packard Motor company, was granted a divorce from his wife, Jessie Margaret Budlong, in a re-script filed in Newport superior court by Judge Edward W. Blodgett today.

The decree was granted on the

grounds of extreme cruelty, consisting of "false charges against his character, humiliating remarks in the presence of others, refusal to live with him as his wife, and other acts tending to bring him into public ridicule."

Work on Foundation Begun This Week by Contractor

A residence with no peer in southern Oregon, a home which will cost in the neighborhood of \$35,000, is now under construction on the corner of First and Washington.

It is to be the future domicile of Claude H. Daggett, president of the Ewauna Box company, and will occupy one of the best residential home sites in the city.

Ground for the 14 room structure was broken this week. Building stone, for the foundation of the building, is being assembled and laid.

Superstructure of the beautiful residence will be of old brick and the roof will be of old tile. The new home is being built on the crest of a hill which overlooks Klamath Falls, Lake Ewauna and provides a sweeping view of the Klamath basin and mountains to the south.

It is expected that the residence will be ready for occupancy late in the autumn.

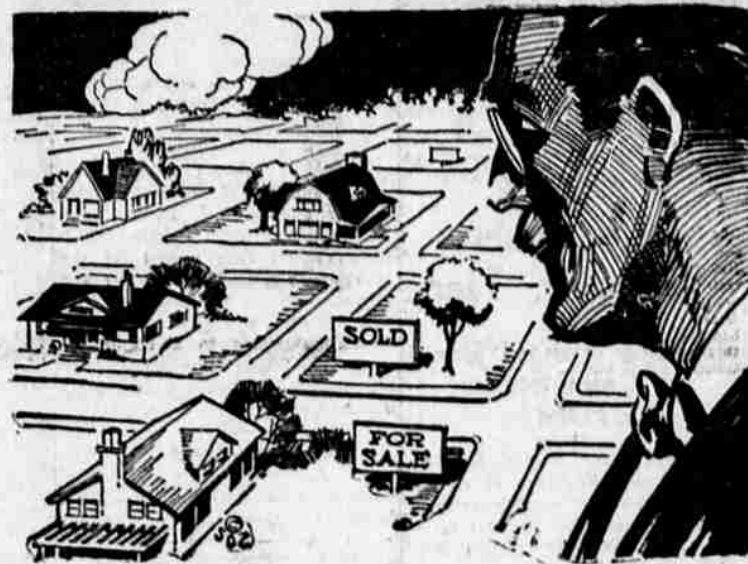
Honor System Is Declared Failure

MANILA, P. I., July 24. (AP)—A policy of confining the worst Moro criminals from Mindanao and Sulu in Bilbid prison in Manila instead of at the San Ramon Penal Colony at Zamboanga, has been inaugurated. A dozen of the most desperate convicts have been brought here.

At the San Ramon colony the prisoners are placed on their honor to a large extent, with the result that many of them have escaped and formed outlaw bands which have terrorized the Moro country.

CHLORINES STRIKE

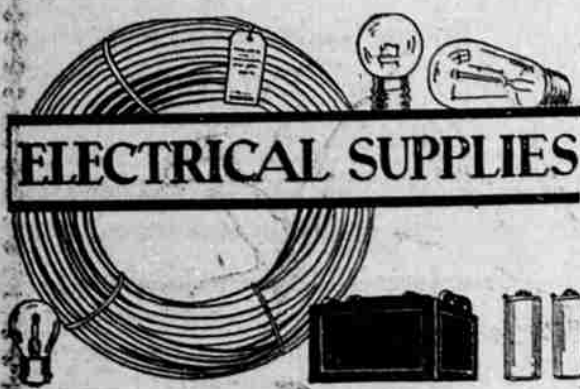
