

## POE VALLEY ROUTE IS DEMANDED

Seek a New Market Road From Merrill Toward Bonanza

Opening gun of the campaign for a new Klamath market road — from The Dalles-California highway at Merrill east ten miles to connect with the Poe Valley market road — was sounded late Saturday afternoon before the Klamath county court by a large delegation supported by one of the largest petitions submitted before the county court in the past few years.

The wishes of the delegation were plain and to the point. They desired to have the county road from Merrill east to connect with the Poe Valley market road designated as a market road. In support of their petition they pointed out that the districts of Merrill and Poe Valley, geographically, are close together, but that because of the present road system, they are far apart.

Asks for Market Road  
They asked the county court to recommend to the state highway department that the road be designated as a state market road and that some work be done this year toward its improvement.

Three petitions were presented, one from Merrill included 122 signatures; from Poe Valley, 48 signatures, and from Bonanza, 38 signatures. The delegation was composed of A. Kalina, H. E. Wilson, C. M. Kirkpatrick, Richard Tackett,

Fred Zlabek, Frank Victorian and John Reber from Malin; L. Berhart, Glen Van Meter, Joe Taylor, James Sholth, L. G. Gifford, and petition from Merrill was still out.

The county court listened attentively to the delegations and at the end of their statement County Judge Fred R. Goddard told the delegation that the court would refer the matter to the county court engineering department which, after an investigation, would report back to the county court.

## CHINA ASSURED NO ATTACK IN PROSPECT NOW

Marines Will Not Land on Foreign Shores Unless Necessary

WASHINGTON, Feb. 4. (AP).—Although the American government is moving additional naval strength in the direction of Shanghai, threatened by the contesting Chinese war lords, Chinese officials have been assured that there is no intention of making a landing unless American lives actually are in danger.

These assurances have been given to Dr. Alfred Soe, Chinese minister here, in response to an informal inquiry as to the purpose of the movement of additional naval vessels and marines toward Shanghai.

The minister did not lodge a diplomatic protest but merely inquired for information, for the purpose of anticipating any possible protest which might be lodged by Eugene Chen, foreign minister of the southern forces at Hankow. He was told that activity of the navy department was entirely precautionary.

Dr. Soe feels that assurances given are calculated to prevent any animosity by the Cantonese toward America such as that displayed at Canton toward the British.

A demand that Secretary Kellogg inform congress was whether the American government has "any secret understanding" with foreign powers over use of military force in China was made in a resolution today by Representative Black, democrat, New York. He requested the house foreign affairs committee to summon the secretary for questioning.
