overflowing the right of way of the Southern Pacific at Eleventh street and at Vorheis crossing, suspension of traffic. Southbound passenger train number 12, is still held in this city. Train number 53 is held at Gold Hill and the northbound Shasta Limited was routed over the new Cascade line via Klamath Falls. The trains held in this vicinity will be released by noon, railroad officials reported.

#### Traffic Demoralized.

Automobile traffic over the Pacific highway is demoralized, the roadbed being under water between this city and Gold Hill. Twenty-five tourists stalled Saturday night in a raging blizzard in the Siskiyou mountains were released when the warm wind rapidly melted the 18 inches of snow on the Pacific highway.

A portion of the Medford-Jacksonville and Rich-Jacksonville highways was dynamited Sunday in an effort to divert the course of Griffin Creek.

#### Rogue Overflows.

Rogue river overflowed and spread out over the lowlands and is running level over Ray Gold dam.

Many small bridges and culverts in the country districts were washed out and many others weakened by the waters.

The rise of Bear creek yesterday afternoon the stream was bankfull. By six o'clock it was wheel deep on automobiles on Main street.

#### Tourist Cabins Float Away.

Fifteen tourists cabins of the Merick Motor Camp located on the banks of Bear creek were washed away and at Edgewood, private summer camp on Rogue river, summer cottages were washed.

The senior high school here was closed today owing to twelve teachers being marooned out of town, or from sickness. The basements of the business districts were flooded, including the federal building and the Meaford and Terminal hotels.
