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Mule Deer and Diamond Lake Trout Protected By Statutes Enacted At Last Legislature

The deer hunter and the fisherman were closely affected by two laws passed at the last session of the state legislature for the protection of both types of sportsmen were protected by new laws enacted.

One was Diamond lake, where by the opening of fishing season was extended from April 15 to June 1. Proponents of the bill first wanted the lake to open to fishing July 1 or June 15, but A. M. Collier, representative from this district secured a compromise whereby June 1 was set as the opening date.

Another bill was the creation of the Groh ranch and adjacent territory in the southwestern corner of Lake county into a mule deer game refuge.

River and Lake Are Both Open For Fishermen

"Legislature passed a law reading that upper Klamath lake from Modoc Point to Eagle Ridge shall be open to trout fishing the entire year. Link river and Lake Kwauna shall be open for angling the entire year. Law is effective 90 days from the close of the legislature."

The above is a special telegram to the Evening Herald in which the state game commission made plain the new law by which Klamath lake is opened to fishing the entire year.

Link river and Lake Kwauna, contrary to the general understanding here, is open to fishing.

Klamath lake below Eagle Ridge and Modoc Point is open to fishing. Above those two points, the lake is subject to regular fishing season regulations.

All Golf Clubs To Eventually Be Steel, Claim

George Duncan, British golf "pro," has returned to England from the United States worried over the question of golf clubs. He is convinced that the supply of good hickory for making shafts is inadequate and that the ultimate employment of steel shafts is inevitable.

The question is regarded as a likely problem for golf authorities in view of the enormous growth of the game not only in the United States but in England and Germany. So far the Royal and Ancient Club has declared against the use of steel shafts.
