NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that, pursuant to a decree of foreclosure and sale made and entered by the District Court of the United States for the District of Oregon on the 7th day of February, 1927, in the above entitled cause, I, Robert F. Maguire, Master in Chancery in and for said court and cause, will sell at public auction to the highest bidder or bidders for cash, at the front door of the Court House of Klamath County, Oregon, in the city of Klamath Falls, at the hour of 4:45 o'clock P. M. on the 22nd day of March, 1927, the following described property situated in the county of Klamath and state of Oregon, to-wit:

1. The NW-1/4 of the NW-1/4 and the NW-1/4 of the NE-1/4 of Section 13; and the NE-1/4 of the NE-1/4 of Section 14; Twp. 38 S. R. 13 E. W.M.; and the SE-1/4 of the NE-1/4 and the E-1/2 of the SE-1/4 of Section 20; and the NE-1/4 of the NE-1/4 of Section 29; Twp. 38 S. R. 12 E. W.M.; and Lots 1, 2, 3, and 4, or the W-1/2 of the W-1/2 of Section 30, Twp. 37 S. R. 12 E. W.M.

MANY WOUNDED SOLDIERS

PEKING, March 14.—Six hundred wounded soldiers have arrived at Peking, indicating that the fighting in Honan is developing on a large scale.

Under cover of Marshal Chang Tso-Lin's artillery, the Northern-

ers are continuing to cross the Yellow river, despite strong opposition from the Honanese.

Recent events in Kiangsi and Ankwai provinces have deprived Marshal Chang Tso-Lin of help from General Chang Tsung-Chang the Shantung leader, which previously had been planned.

Later dispatches show that the Northern forces intend to meet Chin Yun-Ao's menace by attacking his rear through northern Ankwai province, while 60,000 reinforcements are being brought down from the Mukden area (Manchuria) to assist Chang Tso-Lin's main advance. The first contingents of these troops are already passing through.

Arched Roof
May Be Put
On Big Barn

A Lamella roof, an interwoven wooden arch, first developed in Germany for covering airplane hangars, may be used by D. E. Alexander, local stockman, in the erection of a show barn which he contemplates building on his ranch near Adam's point.

The Lamella roof is achieving wide favor on the Pacific coast. It is built of "lamellas" or pieces of wood, varying in size according to the magnitude of the roof under construction. The lamellas, or blocks, or boards, are fitted together over arched rafters, sprung into place, and bolted together. The assembled roof, which, when the lamellas are cut, may be put together by common labor, is the same as one huge warped board covering the building. Iron rods prevent the arch from springing. The finished product is as strong as a steel roof, far lighter, and one third as expensive. It withstands the strain of wind, earthquakes, or other stress, better than steel.

The chief advantage of this roof, and its point of interest to lumbermen, is that it permits the utilization of short lengths, for years the bane of the lumberman's existence.

An average of one Lamella roof per day is being constructed in Los Angeles.

The McArthur Court, University of Oregon's new basketball stadium, has a Lamella roof, and for a time the university was considering roofing the football field.
