Fastest Train Named Cascade

Name of the new fast train which will operate on a 23 and one half hour schedule between Portland and San Francisco by way of Klamath Falls, will be the "Cascade" according to word received late yesterday by J. J. Miller, district freight and passenger agent.

Announcement of the inauguration of the new fast train service was made one month ago. Appointments of the new train will set a new standard in rail passenger service. It will make its first run April 17. The train will leave San Francisco at 4:40 p. m., arrive in Klamath Falls, 4:30 a. m.

It will leave Portland 10 p. m. and arrive here the following morning.

Slight Decrease In Pine Business During Last Week

NEW YORK, Apr. 1. (AP) — A slight decrease in new business of the country's soft wood business for the week ended March 26, with virtually no change in production and shipments compared with the preceding week, is reported by the national lumber manufacturers association. Decreases were shown in all three items, compared with a year ago. New business of hard wood mills showed a sharp gain over a year ago. Unfilled orders of 193 southern pine and west coast mills were 542,637,232 feet against 536,871,483 the week before.

Ford Recovering From Auto Crash

DETROIT, Mich., Apr. 1. (AP) — Behind the carefully guarded portals of his great estate at Dearborn, Henry Ford, reputed the world's richest man, flat on his back in bed today, began a long period of adequate rest which his doctors said would fully restore his health.
