ESEL ENGINE SOLVES SMALL MILL PROBLEM

Long Power Secured at Minimal Cost; Used by Illinois Lumber Co.

To obtain steady, strong power at a nominal cost where electric lines do not reach a locality, has been one of the problems met by the small saw mill operator, and according to Bert of the Lumber Co. of this area, apparently it has been solved.

The solution is in a Diesel engine and it does not go on "any" evidence, for he has an installation to which "any" with pride. This new Diesel engine is the first of the Illinois Lumber company which has a contract to cut Weyerhaeuser logs at Aspen Lake—logs that must cut because of the fire in that tract last summer. After weighing every feature of individual power for a small mill, Mr. L. L. Lumber, representing the Illinois Lumber company, has decided to install a Diesel engine in this territory, and for an engine of 120 horsepower was ordered for the

All rules against profanity were violated in getting the engine to Aspen Lake for the roads were bad, all of which caused a tedious work. Finally it was accomplished and the results have been excellent. The mill now cuts 50,000 feet in two shifts of nine hours each. It is fitted with an air starter and is practically an automatic power plant. In nine hours run burns about 50 gallons of the very cheap grade oil which saves the expense, and the owners are greatly pleased with it. "It is the first installation in the entire northwest," said Mr.
