FEDERAL FUNDS OBTAINED FOR FOREST ROADS

Klamath Thoroughfares
Will be Benefitted by
Appropriation

A Forest Service appropriation of \$8000 has been approved for the maintenance of roads in the Deschutes National forest and \$700 for the maintenance of trails according to word received here today. Both sums are considerably greater than appropriation for the same purpose last year.

Construction work will be on two main projects, the Hamner butte road in the La Pine-Crescent districts and the East butte road in the Fort Rock district. The Hamner butte road, started last year, is to be completed at an estimated cost of \$2400. It is an eight mile unit. The East butte road is 11 miles long. It is to cost \$3300.

Another road approved for construction, but which is not on the program until late in the season, is a nine and one-half mile unit into Fish Lake. This is in the Crescent district. Cost of construction has been placed at \$3700. This road may be held up for a time, if the appropriation is needed to complete more urgent projects.

Road crews on duty in the Deschutes national forest in the coming season will be organized into fire-fighting units, with experienced fire fighters serving as foremen.

Prison Stripes At Prison Are Thing Of Past

SALEM, Ore., April 8. (AP)—No convicts at the Oregon state penitentiary will wear the traditional stripes of their kind in future. It was decided by the state board of control here today. All uniforms will be of plain gray cloth, without the red and black horizontal stripes.

Stripes were abolished at the state prison a number of years ago, but were instituted again under the administration of Warden J. W. Little. Little required a few of the most hard-boiled characters about the prison to wear stripes as a special punishment. Jim Lewis, the new warden, told the board this morning that men wearing the stripes were proud of them, were often looked up to with envy by other inmates.
