Trial Date of H. De Autremont Set For May 2

MEDFORD, Ore., April 11. (AP)—Hugh De Autremont, Siskiyou tunnel train bandit and slayer suspect, will go to trial May 2, in the circuit court at Jacksonville

on the indictment, alleging that Coyte O. Johnson of Ashland, a brakeman, came to his death at his hands, according to a decision made public this morning by District Attorney Newton Chancey.

Johnson at the time of his death was an extra brakeman, riding on the train which was held

up October 11, 1923, in the Siskiyou tunnel.

Johnson was enroute to Dunsmuir, Calif., where he had been assigned to railroad duty. While the holdup was in progress he left his seat in the smoking car and proceeded towards the locomotive.

As he came around the cowcatcher of the engine and in the dim light of the tunnel portal, the evidence indicates, according to officials, he met the robbers. A desperate struggle ensued and the condition of the ground afterwards showed, that Johnson, a powerfully built man had waged a vigorous fight. He was killed by a gunshot wound and when the relief party arrived, he was dying.

Hugh C. Mitchell Superintendent Of Hatcheries

MEDFORD, Ore., April 11. (AP)—The new state fish commission at its first meeting today named Hugh C. Mitchell as state superintendent of hatcheries, to succeed R. E. Clanton, who submitted his resignation today.

The commission voted the office of master fish warden vacant, relieving A. W. Franklin, who succeeded E. I. Dillagh on December 15, 1926. M. T. Hoy, auditor, was made acting warden to serve until the commissioners choose a permanent officer.

Both Franklin and Clanton were allowed 60 days leave of absence with full pay.
