

LIBERAL ARMY IS DISBANDED

General of Defeated Forces Flees Over Mountains to Safety

WASHINGTON, April 12—(AP)—The entire military supply of the Sacasa liberal army has been captured by the forces of President Diaz, the Nicaraguan legation here declared it had been informed in cable advices.

General Moncada, the liberal military commander, has escaped over the mountains to Rio Negro

on the Atlantic coast, the reports said, being accompanied by only eight of his followers.

The legation's statement also said that Sacasa's army had disbanded and its general headquarters at Matiguas had been captured.

Poe Valley Favors Large Bond Issue; Need Better Roads

Poe Valley, at a community meeting last night, not only endorsed the proposed half million dollar bond issue to complete the construction of trunk line county roads, but also asked that three roads in their section be included in the general construction program

which would be undertaken if the bond issue was approved. One road would lead west from the Hiram Robert ranch into the timber; another would lead south from Poe Valley toward Malin; and a third would connect Malin with the Poe Valley market road and obviate the roundabout connection via the Lakeview Junction.

County Judge Fred R. Goddard, and County Commissioners Horace Dunlap and Burrell Short were guests of the community. The court assured the assemblage that they would remember the Poe Valley section if the bond issue was approved by the electorate.
