Two Places Open In C. M. T. C. For Klamath Youths
Active preparations for the Citizens' Military Training camp for infantry, to be held at Vancouver barracks from June 17 to July 16 are under way at the present time and places have been reserved for two Klamath boys. A complete tent camp, equipped with showers, bath houses, kitchens and mess halls will be in place ready for the 375 boys who are expected to take advantage of the opportunity for military and citizenship training during the vacation months.
The camp is open to boys between the ages of 17 and 24 inclusive, for the basic course. Expense of going to camp and returning home will be paid by the government and each boy will be furnished with uniform, food and shelter, free of charge, while at camp.

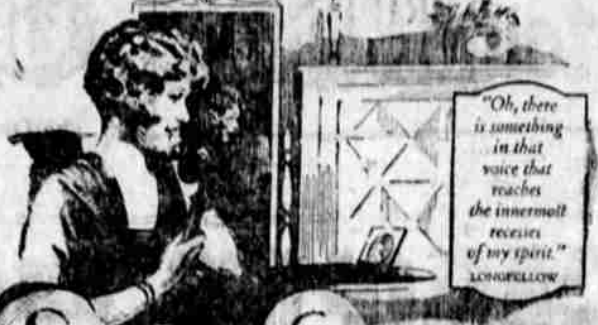

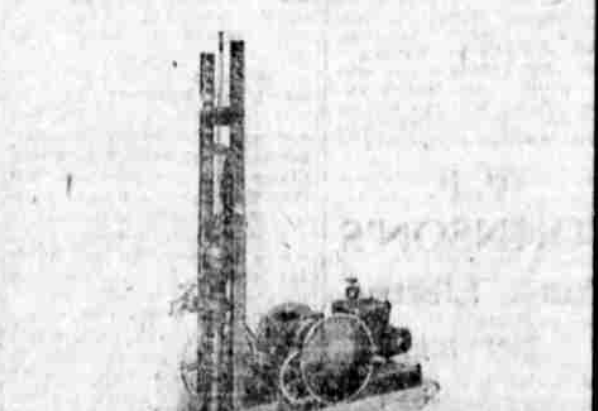
