Child Health Day Programs Are Prepared

Schools of Klamath are preparing for National Child Health day programs and the Klamath County Health Association will present a health day exhibit at the Klamath Falls public library on April 30. It was announced today by Miss Hazel McClelland, county health nurse.

Nearly every primary school in Klamath will recognize National Child Health day—May 1—on Friday, April 29. Inasmuch as May 1 comes on a Sunday, it is necessary to stage programs on Friday, the last day of the school week.

Prizes Offered
Klamath county public health association has offered prizes for each class in primary grades for the best health poster, health poem and health story. The prize winners and other exhibits will form the nucleus of the health exhibit.

Mrs. Z. J. Powell, chairman of the educational committee of the Klamath county public health association, is in general charge of the work. Miss Helen Canfield will direct the poster contests in city schools; Miss McClelland will have charge of county schools south of Klamath Falls; and County Health Nurse Miss Lydia Fricke will be in charge of schools north of Klamath Falls.

WOOL MARKET STILL FAVORS BUYER IN EAST

Prices Have Not Changed Materially in Past Week, Report Says

BOSTON, April 22.—(AP)—The Commercial Bulletin tomorrow will say:

"The wool market at the eastern seaboard still moves in a very narrow channel.

"Prices have not changed materially for the week, although the tendency has been in favor of the buyer still. The few purchases in the west indicate little change there, sheering being still delayed in a number of sections. "As for the goods market, developments are slow, though rather encouraging in certain respects. Combers and spinners, however, report a narrow, easy market.

Foreign Easier
"The foreign markets are generally a bit easier both in the primary and the secondary markets, although not materially lower. Yorkshire, however, as well as the continent appears to regard the current easier tendency as merely temporary.

478 INCHES OF SNOW
Anyhow, no one can say it doesn't snow in southern Oregon. "The total fall since November 1, 1926, has been 478 inches in Crater Lake national park," declares Colonel C. G. Thomson, superintendent of the park, who came to Portland to confer with the highway commission. "This snow compacted to 18 feet 3 inches. This was at an altitude of 7000 feet. We expect to open up the park on time. If we secure mechanical snow equipment. Anyway, the big thing is that southern Oregon is assured of abundant irrigation." Colonel Thomson is pleased that the Sand Creek entrance has been selected for a connection with The Dalles-California highway. This makes more available the pinnacles, one of the greatest geological features in the park. Some of these pinnacles tower more than 200 feet, and the tallest is 304 feet. They are the result of erosion and give a weird effect to the landscape and are rather awe-inspiring. Scientists, states the colonel, generally take a quick look at the lake and then make a bee-line for the pinnacles, where they are content to remain for a day at a time, studying them and the formation. A thrilling motion picture was staged in the pinnacles a few years ago. The colonel is registered at the Multnomah.—Oregonian.

MEAD COMING
Dr. Elwood Mead, commissioner of the United States bureau of reclamation, is expected in Portland next month to see representatives of reclamation projects in central and eastern Oregon. The tentative dates set for his visit here are May 6 to 9, inclusive.

Among the matters to be discussed is the disposal of excess land holdings. About half the land on the Vale project was acquired by a few owners through grants given by the government in exchange for the building of a military wagon road years ago. On government reclamation projects not more than 160 acres of irrigable land may be owned by a single private party.

A large amount of land in the Owyhee project also must be contracted for disposal.—Oregonian.

Commission To Improve Short Piece of Road

Plans of the state highway commission for improvement and maintenance of the Ashland-Klamath Falls highway between Keno and the Pacific highway became known today.

The commission, it is learned, will probably confine work on the Ashland-Klamath Falls highway to resurfacing from the junction of the highway with Pacific highway to Keno creek, a distance of seven and one-half miles.

Plans of the commission call for resurfacing of the Keno Creek-Keno section of the state highway next year. Oiling of the thoroughfare would follow the resurfacing.
