TIMBERMEN TO DISCUSS SLASH

Meeting of Owners With State and Government Officials Is Scheduled

One of the serious problems before Klamath timbermen and forest fire protection agencies, the method of slash disposal, is the cause of a meeting between representatives of timber owners and state and government officials which will be held here May 15. It was announced today by J. F. Kimball, secretary of the Klamath Forest Protective association.

Included in the officials and timber representatives who are expected are: State Forester F. A. Elliott, his first assistant, Porter King, E. H. McDaniels, representative of the United States Forest Service, Captain J. H. Woods, representative of the Long Hill Lumber company and other state and United States forestry representatives.

"A field trip through different logging sections is anticipated," Mr. Kimball said. "The method of slash disposal will be taken up from every angle. The conference will last two days."
