

CRASH VICTIM IS IDENTIFIED

Authorities Ascertain Man
In Thursday Wreck Is
Of Salem

SALEM, Ore., May 13.—(AP)—Identification of Jack Domogalla, 29, killed when an automobile crashed through a concrete abutment of an overhead crossing on the coast highway 12 miles north of Oceanside, California, last Thursday night, as a former resident of Salem and son of Mr. and Mrs. F. K. Domogalla, this city, was completed this

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morning upon receipt of a telegram from the coroner at Oceanside. Charles E. Meader, believed to have been fatally injured in the crash and whose address in press dispatches reporting the accident was given as Portland, has also been identified as the man with whom Domogalla left Salem about four months ago to operate a restaurant in Marshfield.
