DRINK BILL OF KING WAS HEAVY

Edward VIII Lived Sumptuous Existence; Cellular Shown

HAMPTON, England, May 13.—(AP)—The wine cellar of Henry VIII, revealed in the course of restoration work at Hampton Court Palace, is open for public inspection. With its stone pillars carrying a groined roof, the cellar is exactly as it was in Tudor times.

Regulation for the management of Henry VIII's cellars show that the drinkables consumed by the royal household cost an equivalent in modern currency of \$250,000 a year, the king's table alone costing for drink and food a sum of about \$100,000 a year.

In addition to what they could drink at the public table, a duke or duchess had a personal allowance of a gallon of ale in the morning, another in the afternoon, and another, with a pitcher of wine, after supper. A countess, however, was allowed nothing at all after supper.

Adjoining the wine cellar is a "drykynge howse," the resort of Shakespeare and his fellows of the king's company of actors, where they received their daily allowance of a gallon of ale.

That for and in consideration of the amount of moneys furnished for the said operations by the said party of the second part, the said party of the first part agrees to assign, transfer and set over to the party of the second part a pro rata interest in all of the holdings and equipment of said party of the first part in proportion to the total amount of expenditures made in the operation and drilling said well by both the party of the first part and party of the second part.

It is hereby fully understood and agreed by and between both parties that the lease or leases upon which said well shall be drilled shall be in contact and confined to one single body of not less than 480 acres; that all of the additional 5000 acres or more shall be contiguous in not less than 80 sub-division tracts from all directions from the 480 acres upon which said well is to be located.

It is further agreed to by and between both parties that the said J. E. Loreman shall have full and complete charge of all of the drilling operations and general supervision and management for the party of the first part.

American Petroleum Company Guarantees \$25,000 To Help Finance J. E. Loreman Well

A start has been made in the financing of Loreman's oil development in Southern Oregon, and when analyzed it is not a bad start. The American Petroleum Company, represented by W. H. Marston who was here last week and inspected the leases, has agreed to finance the last \$25,000 worth of drilling on a 4,500 foot well.

It may sound strange that the contract was made to finance the last portion of the drilling, but the reason for this is that the last end of an oil well is invariably the end that gives the trouble, and many a well is tied up, and good endeavors go to pieces over the last end.

J. E. Loreman is an old geologist, an old oil man and he knows what befalls oil undertakings; hence he is financing the last end first, to make sure that when his drill has reached 3,000 feet he will not be held up in the customary financial delays.

Mr. Loreman has worked two years on the geology of the Bonanza country, running out the croppings and analyzing the formations. His maps show exhaustive information carefully compiled and now he is ready to set his rig and begin operation.

Opened Montana Field
The man who is at the helm of this oil development of the Bonanza district is none other than the Loreman of Montana fame. He is the one who went into the Montana country and located two fields which have made many rich men. His advice, when heeded, has brought good results for he told them where to drill and where not to drill.

For a long time he has held the belief that the Klamath Basin holds the same oil possibilities thatakersfield and Taft, California, have proven and with this in mind he

started in to make preliminary geological surveys. These have been completed and now he is ready to steam up his Standard rig and begin work. Necessarily he will seek finances for a portion of this work, but the life saving belt has been arranged which guarantees the latter end of the work.

Extracts from the contract between J. E. Loreman and the American Petroleum Company follow:

5,000 Acres Included
WHEREAS, the party of the first part has secured and holds under lease certain oil and gas rights; a copy of said lease is hereto attached and marked Exhibit "A," said leases being located in Townships 35 and 39, South of Ranges 11 and 12 in Klamath County, Oregon, there being included in said leases 5000 acres or more; exact legal sub-division of said acreage is hereto attached as a true description according to the United States Government Survey of the leases agreed to be included in this agreement, marked Exhibit "B."

All of said described leases are vested in the party of the first part. WHEREAS, the party of the first part agrees to furnish a complete standard drilling equipment and place the same on some part of the said lands included in the leases hereto described, and to commence the drilling of a well on some part of said lands within ninety days from the date of the execution of this agreement, and to expend the sum of \$25,000.00 or more in the drilling of a well on some portion of the said lands herein included, the said sum of \$25,000.00 to be expended shall include the cost of transportation of the equipment and the moving of the same to the location selected for the drilling of said well. The selection of the location for said well shall be left entirely to the discretion of J. E. Loreman of Klamath Falls, Oregon.

The Saving Contract
WHEREAS, the said part of the first part after expending the sum of \$25,000.00 or more and the sum has been expended and a true and itemized account of said expenditures is shown, and it is determined by the said officers and directors of the said party of the first part that it is impossible for the said party of the first part to secure any further finances in its operations of the drilling of said well, and it is desired by the said party of the first part to continue said drilling operations to a depth of not to exceed 4500 feet, then, and in that event, and having notified the party of the second part in writing that the party of the first part will surrender to the party of the second part the right and privilege to take full charge of said operations and continue the drilling of the said well to a depth of 4500 feet unless a commercial producing well is secured at a lesser depth.

NOW, THEREFORE, the said party of the second part agrees to and with the said party of the first part that at any time there has been an actual expenditure of \$25,000.00 or more made by the said party of the first part in the drilling of said well, then, and in that event said party of the second part may at its election either take full and complete charge of the drilling operations of said well, together with all the equipment and material and continue said operations, or it may furnish additional finances for the completion of said well under the
