"Hal" Chase, Pelican spitball flinger, will spread a bit of saliva on the ball, his honor, the "umps," will bellow the old familiar, "Play Ball!" and the 1927 Southern Oregon Baseball league season will be officially opened in Klamath Falls.

At the fair grounds park at 2:30 tomorrow several hundred Klamath fans will help to inaugurate the official local opening when they witness the two league leaders, the Pelicans and the Grants Pass Cavemen, come to grips in a baseball classic to determine the league supremacy.

Both teams to date have been undefeated. The Pelicans, without question, are the fastest aggregation of ball players that have ever worn the Pelican uniforms. "Sandy" Saunders, the even-tempered little manager of the locals, has one of the fastest bush league ball teams in the northwest, and all dope points to a local victory tomorrow.

Grants Pass, however, is a team to be reckoned with. Grants Pass has always been a real baseball town. The kids start playing there before they are scarcely able to toddle, and for that reason they always have a real team, as was evidenced last year when they were up in the running at the close of the season.

At any rate, it's going to be a great game, and indications all point to one of the largest opening day crowds that ever boosted a Pelican team in the history of Klamath.

Budd In Favor Of Immediate Work On Line

WENATCHEE, Wash., May 14. (AP)—No decision can be reached by the Oregon Trunk Railway in regard to new construction in central Oregon authorized today by the I. C. C. until the commission's order has been studied. Ralph Budd, president of the Great Northern Company said here today. "From the press report," Budd said, "it is not clear what route the Oregon Trunk is given permission to build on. If permission is on what is called route 'D' I would be in favor of having the Oregon Trunk proceed at once so that work would be under way before June 17."

The I. C. C. specifically gave the Oregon Trunk authority to build from Bend to Klamath Falls, providing it began work before June 17. Route "D" Budd explained, is an independent railway running from Bend to Klamath Falls. The alternate route formerly proposed was from Bend to a point on the Southern Pacific Natron cut-off 65 miles from Bend and from there the Oregon Trunk was to make arrangements, if possible, to use the Southern Pacific line to Klamath Falls.
